



Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul

This feast always occurs on June 29. This year it falls on a weekend, therefore our Masses will celebrate the martyrdom of Saint Peter, our first pope, and Saint Paul, the great evangelist. Both were executed for their faith. Our diocese has relics of Saint Peter and Saint Paul in Saint Anthony Chapel on Troy Hill. Pope Leo today will place the pallium vestment on those new archbishops appointed since last summer.

Masses this Friday at all three churches will be celebrated at 9:00 am. Let's thank the Lord for our country and our freedoms with the Holy Eucharist.

The American bishops write: Because we are a people of both faith and reason, it is appropriate and necessary for us to bring this essential truth about human life and dignity into the public square. Some question whether it is appropriate for the Church to play a role in political life. However, the obligation to teach about moral values that should shape our lives, including our public lives, is central to the mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ (Faithful Citizenship).






Saint Gregory Improvements

Before Divine Grace Parish was established in 2022, the former Saint Gregory Parish raised funds as a part of the diocesan *Church Alive* campaign. Those donations totaled **\$190,968** as of Apr. 30, 2025.

The original Case for Support approved by the Finance Council designated money for HVAC upgrades, audio improvements, security cameras, redesigning the organ space area, and handicap spaces.

Much of this work has been completed through our regular maintenance. We have cameras inside and outside the church, the school has a completely new HVAC system, the church received an enhanced HVAC system along with new HVAC in the sanctuary, the organ space has been redesigned with new flooring, the church bells were repaired, and the cry room/restroom/sacristy have new flooring. These projects totaled \$334,609.

Recently, we had to repair the church skylight due to persistent water leaks at a cost of **\$65,836**. We also installed a new lighting system for the church at a cost of **\$100,461**. The Finance and Pastoral councils on May 21 approved the transfer of the **\$190,968** to cover the balance of these necessary projects.

Thanks to your generosity, our Saint Gregory campus is well-prepared for the future so we can focus on our mission of evangelization and faith formation. We appreciate your support.



Unpacking the Word

Acts 12:1-11

Note: If you attend Mass on Saturday evening this weekend, you'll hear a different first reading from earlier in Acts.

The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul takes precedence over what would be the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Throughout much of the world, though not in the United States, it is a Holy Day of Obligation, and it celebrates the two pillars of the early Church who helped establish Christianity in the heart of the Roman Empire.

The Herod mentioned in the first reading is neither the Herod of Jesus' birth (his grandfather) nor the Herod of Jesus' trial (his brother-in-law); this one is Herod Agrippa I, ruler of Judea from A.D. 41-44. The martyrdom of James the Greater, son of Zebadee, happened near the end of this Herod's reign. Peter's arrest during Passover at the hand of a Herod leads one to suspect that this story will follow a similar course as Jesus's Passover arrest during the reign of a different Herod. Yet the Lord's plan in this instance was to rescue Peter by the hand of an angel, a non-bodily spirit that can act in the physical world.


This is Peter's third imprisonment recorded in Acts (see 4:3 and 5:18) and the second time he is rescued by an angel (see 5:19). It's interesting that, even though he has experienced this type of miraculous rescue before (in addition to all the miraculous things he witnessed during Jesus' ministry), Peter initially didn't think it was real. Sometimes we might feel the same way. Despite the many times the Lord has shown up in our lives, helped us through a difficult time, or just given us an unexpected grace, when he does it again sometimes we think it isn't real, that it's a vision, or that we just don't fully understand the cause. It couldn't be the Lord, right?

Today's solemnity encourages us to reflect on how the Lord brings about incredible things through our ordinary efforts. Peter and Paul both were human beings with limitations and even outright failures in ministry. And yet through their efforts, the Lord planted his Church in Rome, and from there it has spread to the ends of the earth. What might the Lord be doing through your ordinary efforts? Perhaps God actually is at work in your life in ways that you attribute to something else. It could be the Lord, right?

What is Faith Formation at Home?

Research continues to show that faith is best passed on from parent to child. This program for students in all grades will facilitate this with family-style learning in the comfort of your own home and on your own schedule. Families will be supported by a weekly email from the parish detailing the material to be covered that week and including brief teaching videos explaining the weekly materials and supplemental materials (additional videos, worksheets, and printables).

Faith Formation at Home involves five steps each week, which will be spelled out in each weekly email:

- 1. Begin with prayer Reciting basic prayers is the easiest way to memorize them.
- Explore the Sunday Gospel Follow a simple format to reflect and share what God says to you.
- Read and discuss a handful of catechism questions and/or an additional Bible story. Ageappropriate resources keep the whole family focused on the same topic and able to share what they learn.
- 4. Complete the Learning Check-in in your email A simple Google form that shows your family has completed the week's material.
- Conclude with prayer Sharing your prayer intentions with each other enhances your bond as a family.


STREAMING THROUGH SPACE

Meet the Newest Priests of the Diocese of Pittsburgh

Father Alec Scheuer Home Parish: Saint James, Washington, PA



Father Alec was born on February 10, 1991 in South Korea. He was adopted when he was four months old and has two older sisters and one younger sister, who is also adopted.

He attended elementary schools in McLean, Virginia, and in Falls Church, Virginia. He graduated from Bishop O'Connell High School in Arlington, Virginia, in 2009. He enrolled at Mount Saint Mary's University in Emmitsburg, Maryland, in August 2009 and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Communication with a minor in Theology in 2013.

Father Alec's most recent employment was as the Director of Youth Ministry at Immaculate Conception Parish in Washington, PA.

In Fall 2018, he was accepted into the priestly formation program to begin pre-theology studies at Saint Paul Seminary and Duquesne University. After completing his second year of pre-theological studies he was assigned to Saint Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, to begin theological studies in August 2020.


