Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

On **Monday, December 8**, the Universal Church celebrates the Immaculate Conception of Mary. This is a holy day of obligation. Mass schedule: Saint Ferdinand (8:30, Noon, 7:00 pm); Saint Gregory (8:00 am, 9:15 am, 7:00 pm); and Holy Redeemer (9:00 am and 7:00 pm).

What is the Immaculate Conception?

The popular idea that this refers to Jesus' conception is incorrect. Since the early Church, Christians proclaimed this mystery that Mary was conceived without sin. To correct many disbeliefs including Protestant heresy, Pope Pius IX defined this event as a dogma in 1847. Some thought Catholics were exaggerating the role of Mary. However, this Feast is all about Jesus. God prepared Mary as "full of grace" to be the spotless tabernacle and holy temple for the Divine Presence to carry Jesus in her womb without any sin in her being. This Feast also points to us, since the Baptized are prepared to receive Holy Communion and carry the Lord in our bodies having received the Eucharist without sin. While Mary was conceived without sin, she still had the freedom, like Adam and Eve, to choose faithfulness or pride. Adam and Eve chose pride.

Saint Juan Diego

This **Tuesday, December 9**, the Church remembers Saint Juan Diego, a poor Mexican farmer who was baptized at the age of 50 and loved the Eucharist and Mass. In 1531, Mary appeared to him as an Aztec princess announcing that she was the Mother of God and that a church was to be built on that site. She gave him flowers (ones that did not grow in that area) to take to the local bishop. When Juan met with the bishop, he opened his cloak which the flowers were gathered, the imprint of Mary was on his cloak. The church eventually was built, named for Our Lady of Guadalupe, and most of Mexico converted to Catholicism.

Our Lady of Guadalupe

This **Friday, December 12**, is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. All of North, South and Central America has been dedicated to Mary under her title Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. Her appearance to Juan Diego was to support the evangelizing mission of the Church to bring all peoples to Jesus Christ.

Make it a great Advent!

Are you off to a good start in preparing for the birth of Jesus, or was the first week of Advent a challenge with so much to do?

Prioritizing how to best use your time is key

to making this a meaningful Advent. **Ask God to help you** draw near Him. **If you need to schedule prayer time** and spiritual activities, do it.

Begin to practice silence. Find a quiet place for prayer and reflection—no smartphones or other screens. **Establish a daily routine**, setting aside time for prayer and scripture meditation. Six more suggestions:

- **Go to confession.** We are called to repentance during Advent. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is meant to cleanse your soul, which will help you prepare for Christ's birth.
- Attend weekday Mass. Consider going to daily Mass to stay spiritually connected.
- Families: Pray using your Advent wreath. Light the candles these final three Sundays of Advent, reflecting on the themes of peace, joy, and love. See page 6.
- Set up a nativity scene if you haven't already. If you have young children, ask them to look for ways to perform an act of kindness. For each kindness they can add a piece of straw or yarn to the manger to prepare it for Jesus.
- Make a Jesse Tree from your Christmas tree, adding ornaments that represent figures and stories from the Bible, beginning with the Creation through the birth of our Lord.
- Give to those in need. Many worthy ministries and organizations need your help.

Second Week of Advent December 7 – Theme: Peace

- 1. Light the first and second purple candles
- 2. Read from Scripture: "And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." (Luke 2:4-7) (Isaiah 9:2)
- 3. Pray the Advent Wreath Prayer for Week 2: "Dear Jesus, you entered our world on Christmas as the Prince of Peace. This Advent, as we strive to become the best version of ourselves, fill us with a deep and abiding peace. Help us share that peace with everyone we encounter, especially those who need it most. Amen."
- **4. Reflect:** What are your top three priorities as you prepare for Christmas? (*Source: Dynamic Catholic*)








Unpacking the Word

— Isaiah 11:1-10 —

Isaiah's famous Stump of Jesse oracle is his longest and most detailed prophecy of the coming messianic royal child. By the time Isaiah wrote these words, the grand tree of the house of David was beginning to look like Charlie Brown's Christmas tree. Soon it would resemble a smoldering stump more than a dynasty that would last forever. In 587 BC, the Babylonian Empire sacked Jerusalem, destroyed the Temple, and took the upper levels of society into exile. It seemed that God's great promise that one of David's descendants would always sit on David's throne was just wishful reminiscing of a bygone day. But Isaiah prophesied that a shoot would sprout from the stump of David's father Jesse.

This prophecy includes two great promises: a new king and a new creation.

This new king from the line of Jesse's son David will be anointed by the Spirit of the Lord, just as David himself once was (see 1 Samuel 16:13). He will be invested with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts are at the heart of the Rite of Confirmation during the Laying on of Hands which makes the newly confirmed a little christ. The same thing happened at your Confirmation. This coming Messianic King will not judge by appearances, just as the Lord did not judge the young David by his appearance (see 1 Samuel 16:7), and his will be a reign of justice and peace.

The second promise of a new creation takes the form of Eden-like imagery of peaceful coexistence between natural enemies. These pairs of animals represent a reversal of the effects of sin on the natural order and among the nations who war with one another. Who rules over this blissful New Eden? None other than the "little child," the "shoot of Jesse" himself. In this new creation, the People of God will include not only the Jewish people but also the Gentiles.

With Jesus' advent in Bethlehem, the shoot finally sprouted from the stump of Jesse. As an immortal King who can no longer die, Jesus is the ideal fulfillment of God's promise that David's descendants would always sit on the throne. Those of us who follow him also experience the Spirit's anointing and gifts. But Jesus' work is not yet done. God's people longed for the shoot to sprout in the days of Isaiah, and we look forward to his return to inaugurate the Messianic Era of peace and justice. The Lord kept his promises of a king and a shoot, and he will also keep his promise of a glorious return and re-creation.




