From Christmas to Ordinary Time

The Christmas Season concludes with John the Baptist baptizing Jesus in the Jordan which marks the beginning of Jesus' earthly ministry. The sacrament of baptism is also a reminder of the beginning of our own spiritual journey. Do you know the date of your baptism? This is your homework assignment this week. Until Ash Wednesday we will be in the season of Ordinary Time in which we can reflect on how the great celebrations of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany can “order” our lives in the person of Jesus Christ. The word “Ordinary” is from the Latin “ordo” which means to “order” or “anchor.”

A Spiritual Rebirth in Jesus

The Divine Grace parishioner and former NFL player, along with wife **Mana**, recently had their son **Raphael** baptized by Father Jim Wehner.

“It’s such a joy having our children baptized,” Thomas said. “In preparation class we learned about how baptism brings you into the mystical body of Christ. How amazing is that!”

The Baptism of the Lord is an important feast day, initiating the first sacrament of the New Covenant, essential for salvation. It signifies a spiritual rebirth, the start of our Christian journey and relationship with God.

Our own baptism connects us to Jesus’ baptism, giving us new life and sanctifying grace, allowing us to receive other sacraments and share in His divine life and purpose. “In baptism, Jesus was showing us what to do,” Thomas noted. “He didn’t have original sin, but it washes away our original sin and is the beginning of our sacramental life.”

It is through baptism that we are united with Jesus, sharing in the salvation He won by His death and Resurrection. God helps us grow in the virtues of faith, hope, and love, strengthens us in temptations and difficulties, makes our good works fruitful, and encourages us to live and proclaim the Gospel.

Just as Jesus was revealed in His baptism, we are called to live out our new life so others can see Jesus in us. “Our faith is so deep, it’s limitless,” Thomas said.


Save the Dates Lenten Parish Mission: February 21-23

Looking Toward the Future

Parishioners have begun to make legacy gifts to **The Fund for Divine Grace Parish**, building an endowment for future needs. Established through the **Catholic Foundation for Greater Pittsburgh**, Divine Grace is one of the first parishes in our diocese to benefit from a permanent source of support that will grow and produce annual distributions as needed. It will create greater impact through long-term and short-term investments.

Common legacy gifts include estate commitments such as bequests and retirement plans, designations of life insurance policies, matching gifts, and trusts and annuities. Because they are typically funded through assets instead of income, these donations usually cost donors nothing during their lifetimes. The principal is invested through the foundation and grows over time.

Twice a year, the parish can take small distributions if needed, but the principal remains untouched. The Fund is an opportunity to ensure that the next generation of Divine Grace parishioners will benefit from a vibrant, growing faith community. An endowment doesn't replace the weekly offering or the Annual Parish Appeal for diocesan-wide needs – it creates stability and growth to support our mission and ministries.





— Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 —

Our first reading contains the first of Isaiah's famous Servant Songs found in Isaiah 42:1-4, 49:1-6, 50:4-9, and 52:13-53:12. These songs are about, and at times in the voice of the mysterious figure whom Isaiah calls simply "the Servant of the Lord." The Servant is the embodiment of faithful Israel, and as such He has a mission to gather those who have been scattered, to bring people back into covenant relationship with their Creator. In later Servant Songs, Isaiah will reveal that the Servant will also suffer for the sins of the people (see Isaiah 53:4).

The Lord's message through Isaiah has clear echoes in the baptism and ministry of Jesus recorded in the Gospels. The voice from the heavens at Jesus' baptism quotes this passage nearly verbatim: "my chosen one with whom I am pleased." The Lord also points out that this servant figure is the one "upon whom I have put My spirit," and the Gospels recall that at Jesus' baptism this happened "in bodily form like a dove" (Luke 3:22). The final line of Isaiah's message for this week speaks to Jesus' ministry of forgiving sins and healing blindness. All of this prophesied some six centuries prior.

There is a significant change in wording when the Lord echoes what He has already said through Isaiah at Jesus' baptism. Through Isaiah, He refers to His servant, and at the baptism He refers to His beloved Son. Of course the wording of sonship has to do with Jesus' core identity as the Second Person of the Trinity, but it also has to do with us as little Christs. To serve the Lord is to become His beloved daughter or son, His close family. We typically see sonship and servitude as very different things, but the first Christians did not. St. Paul often bragged about being the slave of the Lord (see Titus 1:1 among many others). Mary referred to herself as the "handmaid of the Lord" (Luke 1:38). And you and I are both servants of God and children of God (see 1 John 3:1).

All of this is by the grace of our own baptism, which receives its power from the One who entered the waters of baptism along the banks of the Jordan River.




