Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Every year Christians around the world spend a week asking the Lord how all Christians can one day be united. This year, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is **January 18-25**. What fractured Christianity? Jesus prayed on Good Friday that we would all be one. Satan wants to see a divided Christianity. For the first 1,500 years there was no dispute about the Holy Eucharist, a Church governed by Saint Peter and his successors, and the nature of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. Opinions and emotions would then undermine our Church. So, we pray that all Christians can once again be united into the one Body of Christ. We continue to be blessed here. Since becoming a parish on July 1, 2022, 115 adults have been initiated into the Catholic Church.

First Reconciliation this Week

Congratulations to our second graders who will celebrate their first sacrament of reconciliation – 6:30 pm at all three churches – Monday at Holy Redeemer, Tuesday at Saint Ferdinand, and Wednesday at Saint Gregory.

Pray for the Unborn

On January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion as a national right. The justices in 2022 struck down that ruling; however, they sent the issue of abortion to the states. The Church asks all Catholics to observe a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. May this Thursday be a day of prayer and penance.

On **Friday, January 30** at 7:00 pm, the refurbished organ at Saint Gregory Church will be dedicated with a concert featuring some of the best organists in western

Pennsylvania. All are welcome. There will be a reception in the Bergman Events Center following the concert.

Families Embrace God's Grace through Confession

For many Catholics, the thought of confessing their sins can stir up uneasy feelings and cause hesitation. **Emma Sabados** looks at the sacrament of Reconciliation very differently.

"After Baptism, original sin is wiped away but our fallen nature still tempts us towards sin," says Emma, a coordinator of faith formation at Divine Grace Parish. "However, there is a remedy, a medicine, and that's confession. The sacraments are like a hospital that's available our entire lives."

The parish faith formation team, working closely with parents, has been preparing about 100 second graders for their First Reconciliation for several months. Preparation is also taking place at Saint Gregory School. They've been learning how to examine their conscience, recite the Act of Contrition, and make a good confession to a priest. The best part – absolution and penance, and a big smile upon exiting the confessional. They will share in this experience next week.

"Our parents are engaged in this preparation," Emma says. "They are the primary educators of their children. They have the grace for this job. We help guide and provide support."

The Catechism teaches us that Reconciliation is a gift from Jesus, His saving love and mercy made real to us. We confess our sins to a priest because Jesus entrusted this ministry of reconciliation to the apostles. It's a chance to repent and be reconciled with God and the Church.

Confession is supposed to include a sincere accounting of how we have failed to love God, our neighbor, and ourselves. It is not meant to be a shameful or hurtful process. When we have the courage to truly examine our sinfulness, then we are able to invite Christ into the hidden parts of ourselves that we may have thought were untouchable or unworthy of His love.

"Some parents ask why does a seven-year-old need to go to confession?" Emma shared. "This is when they reach what the Church defines as the age of reason. We begin to understand what it means to offend God through sin, and His mercy that allows us to reconcile with Him again."

Following the Gospel isn't easy, and we should not go it alone. Through confession, God grants us pardon and peace, freeing us to enter a new future.

Disciple Maker Index Survey

It's hard to believe that three years have passed since our diocese first participated in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey administered by the Catholic Leadership Institute. That initial effort helped us understand where we were in our spiritual lives, providing the foundation for our pastoral plan for evangelization, and to better engage all parishioners in deepening their relationship with Jesus.

Bishop Mark Eckman is inviting all parishioners to take part in the second DMI survey. It will be offered beginning on **Ash Wednesday, February 18 and running through Sunday, March 29**. It is the same survey given in Lent of 2023. The purpose is to help our parish assess the effectiveness of our pastoral planning goals and to identify new opportunities and directions for spiritual growth within our community.

Your participation is crucial to our planning process. A good response allows us to gain a clear understanding of our progress and to chart the path forward. More details on how to access the survey will be shared in the coming weeks.

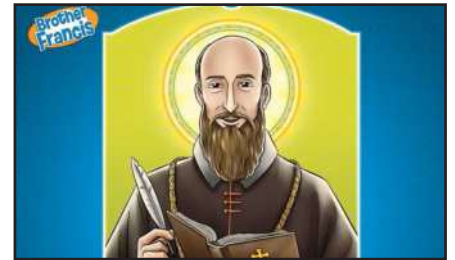
Saint Francis de Sales: Pastor of Souls

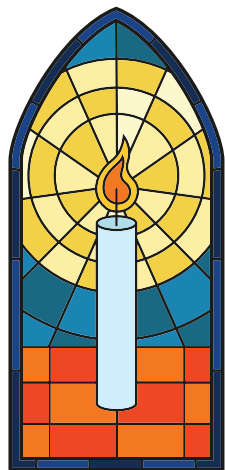

Divine Mercy Cenacle begins January 29

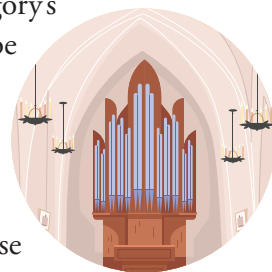

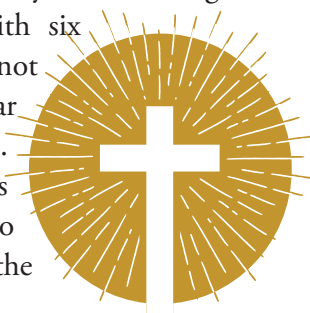

Unpacking the Word

— Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 —

For centuries in the Church's liturgical life, Epiphany was more than a single-day solemnity. It was, in fact, its own season running throughout the month of January. There are remnants of this in the lectionary readings for the first few weeks of Ordinary Time, which focus on the various ways that Jesus manifested (epiphanied) Himself at the beginning of his public ministry: His Baptism, John the Baptist's witness, His first public miracle, and the call of the first disciples. Even our first reading this week has an Epiphany feel to it with the figure of the Servant of the Lord.

This is the fifth of the famous Servant Songs of Isaiah, passages about, and in the case of this reading, in the voice of the mysterious figure whom Isaiah calls simply "the Servant of the Lord." The Servant is the embodiment of faithful Israel, and as such he has a mission to gather those who have been scattered, to bring people back into covenant relationship with their Creator. In later Servant Songs, Isaiah will reveal that the Servant will also suffer for the sins of the people (see Isaiah 53:4). The Church pairs this reading with John 1:29-34 where John the Baptist points to Jesus and says, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." Jesus is the Servant, the embodiment of faithful Israel, who came to gather what was scattered, to extend salvation to all nations, to take away the sins of the world, and to renew our covenant relationship with our Creator.

There is a challenge in this exciting message. The way that Jesus chose to gather all people into God's covenant family is through the Church that He established. He wants to carry that message personally, bodily, to the world, and you and I are members of his Body and ambassadors of Christ (see 2 Corinthians 5:20). Saint Paul will read this passage from Isaiah as a mandate for the Church's mission to the Gentiles (see Acts 13:47). We could rightly reread the opening line of this passage and insert our own names in place of Israel: "The LORD said to me: You are my servant, Jason, through whom I show my glory." We may need to tack on, "...if you'll let me." Again, the Lord speaks directly to each one of us through the voice of Isaiah: "Is it too little for you to be my servant? I will make you a light to the nations."

This week, the Spirit invites us to be servants of the Lord "through whom I show my glory." Can those around us see the Lord's glory through us? We are Christians, little christs. Just as it was through Jesus that God brought salvation to the ends of the earth, it is through you and me that he wants to bring salvation to our end of the earth. It starts by allowing the Servant to renew and strengthen our own covenant relationship with the Lord. Then, and only then, can we manifest His light in a dark world.

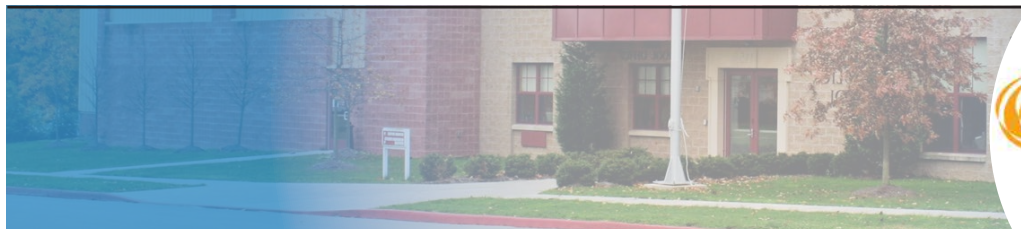

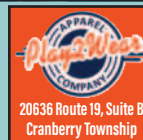

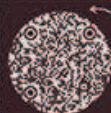
