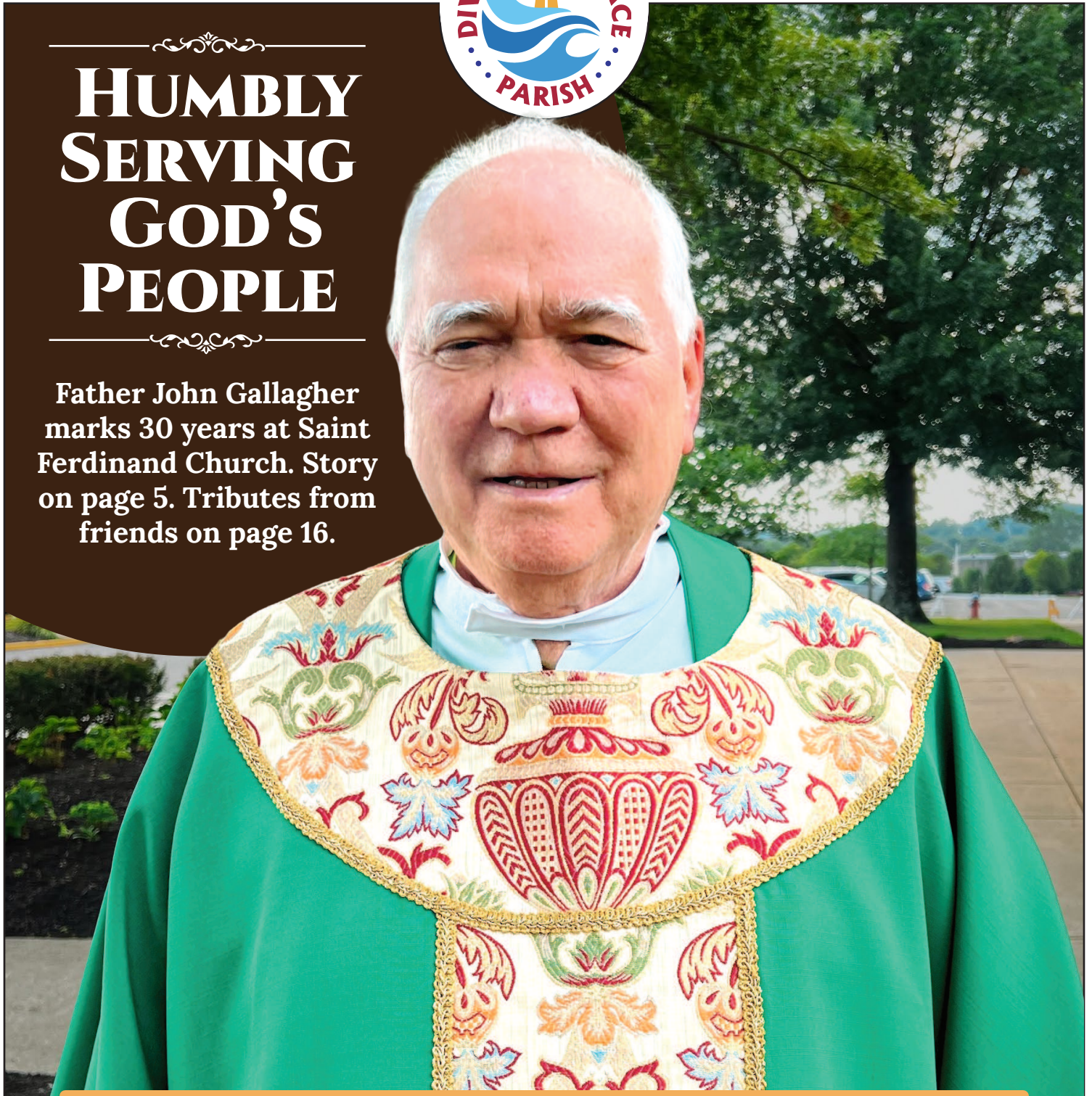

THREE DECADES of Compassionate Service

When **Father John Gallagher** arrived at Saint Ferdinand Parish in January 1996, he had already served as a priest for 28 years. Parishioners at his previous parish were sad to see him go. Members of Saint Ferdinand soon learned why.

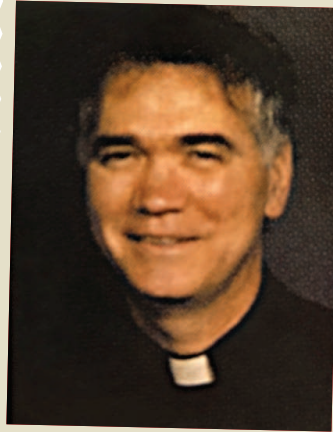
The 30th anniversary of Father Gallagher's ministry at Saint Ferdinand, now Divine Grace Parish – is a remarkable milestone in a life of humble service that began on Mount Washington in Pittsburgh. He graduated from Saint Mary of the Mount grade school and high school. In 1964, he earned a bachelor's degree from Saint Vincent College, then a degree and licentiate in sacred theology from Saint Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore.

Father Gallagher was ordained in 1968 and assigned as parochial vicar at Saint Thomas and Saint Michael parishes in Braddock. In 1974, he went to Our Lady of Grace Parish in Scott Township, and six years later became parochial vicar at Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Bellevue. In 1985 he was named pastor at Assumption, and 11 years later was sent to lead the fast-growing Saint Ferdinand Parish.

Three decades on, Father Gallagher continues to minister to the “little, day-to-day things that are important to people,” as the Pittsburgh Catholic reported in marking his Golden Jubilee in 2018, such as hospital visits, going to funeral homes, visiting school classes, and making communion calls.

To men discerning the priesthood, Father Gallagher asks them to “be gentle and kind to people, be able to work with others, appreciate the role and talents of women in the church, make preaching your number one priority, and remember, it's God's church, not yours.”

Next Steps for Oldenski Hall Renovation

Parishioners are reviewing feedback from the January 12 town hall, which highlighted the need for a larger kitchen and more storage in the multi-use hall that hosted 189 events last year. **Three options** are under consideration: expanding the Saint Ferdinand offices with a covered walkway; building out Oldenski Hall into the east parking lot with a relocated kitchen and interior renovations; or constructing a new one-story building near the Annex, though this option exceeds the available \$2.7 million. Fr. Jim emphasized that supporting parish ministries remains the priority.

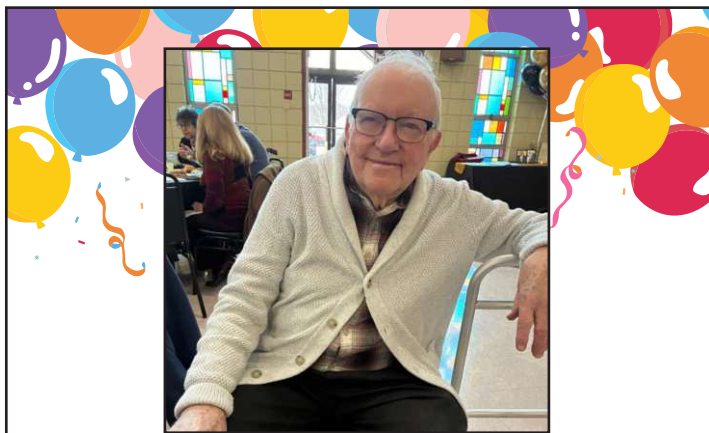
Candlemas/Flame of Love Feast Day

Unpacking the Word

— Isaiah 8:23-9:3 —

Today is Word of God Sunday, a relatively new feast in the Church that celebrates the Lord's revelation to us in the Scriptures. It is an especially fitting day to spend some time resting with the Lord and pondering the readings from Mass.

During Isaiah's ministry, the Assyrian Empire began to dismantle the twelve tribes in the northwestern part of the Holy Land, specifically in "the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali," along the Sea of Galilee. According to Assyrian records, Shalmanassar deported nearly 15,000 Israelites in 721 B.C. beginning with those in this region. They never returned and eventually intermarried with people of other nations in the vast Assyrian Empire, becoming known to history as the lost tribes of Israel. It was indeed a day of darkness, gloom, and distress when ten out of twelve tribes of God's People disappeared from history. And yet, when the "great light," Jesus the Messiah, came to restore Israel, he began the restoration right where it all first fell apart.

When you look back at your life and notice the moments of spiritual unfaithfulness that we all have, where does it all start to fall apart for you? Perhaps that is just the place where the Lord wants to begin restoring you. Did you have a run in with a bad priest? Perhaps the Lord wants to bring a good priest into your life. Did you have a difficult relationship with your parents that caused you to rebel a bit? Perhaps it is through your own parental role or in relationship with another parental figure that the Lord wants to begin a restoration. Is it a struggle with lust? Maybe the Lord is calling you to a deeper love that will not allow you to use people for pleasure. He began Israel's restoration where it all fell apart. He may want to do just the same thing with you and with me.

This message from Isaiah and its historical fulfillment in the life of Jesus shows us that the Lord is not disinterested in the details of your story. He was thoughtful enough to begin Israel's restoration not just anywhere, but exactly where it all fell apart. He wants to transform the darkness and gloom of your life and mine into "abundant joy and great rejoicing." The "day of Midian" is a reference to Gideon's highly improbable victory over the Midianites in Judges 7:1-25, a victory that resulted in forty years of rest (see Judges 8:28). The abundant joy that the Lord wants to usher us into may also seem improbable from our vantage point, and it also involves entering into his rest (see Hebrews 4:10).

Where do you need restoration? Where is the darkness and gloom in your heart? Today, the Spirit invites you to turn it over to him, to let Jesus live there as he lived in Galilee so long ago.

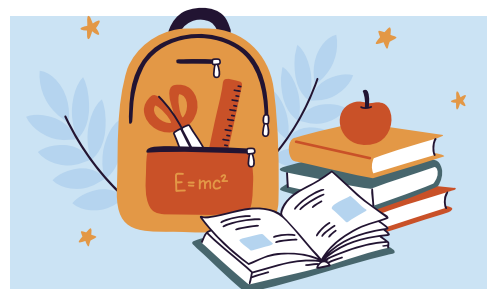

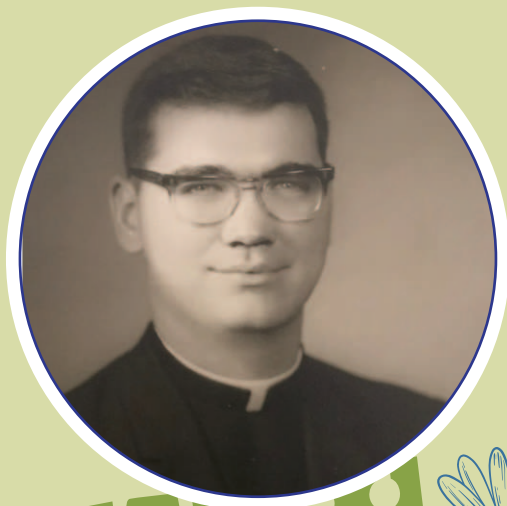
