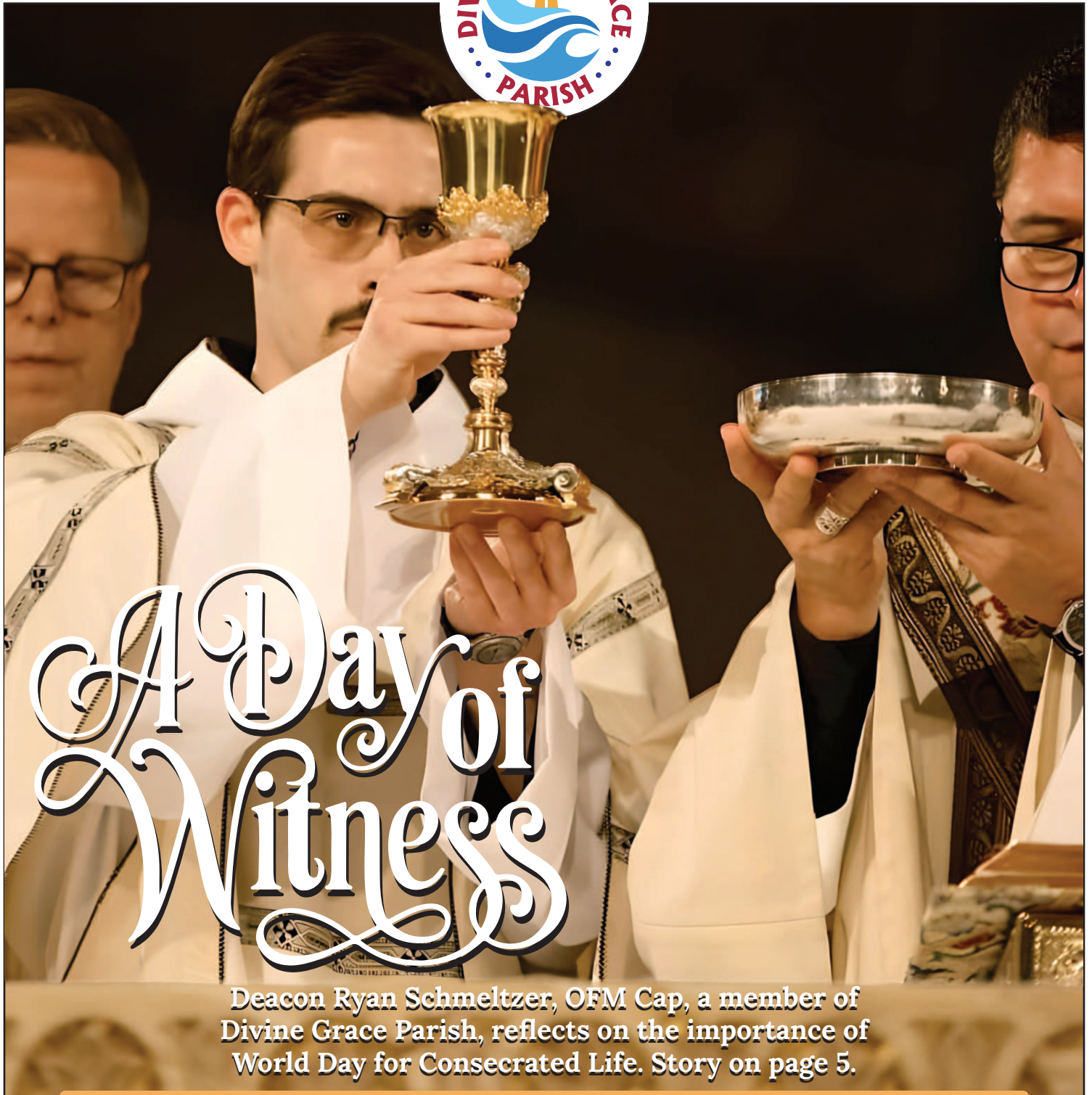

Parishioner and Deacon Appreciates World Day for Consecrated Life

Deacon Ryan Schmeltzer, OFM Cap loved going to Mass as a youngster and grew up curious about the priesthood. Then he attended a Parish Mission with his parents at Saint Ferdinand given by Father Scott Seethaler, OFM Cap.

“Father Scott is responsible for my priestly vocation,” Deacon Ryan said. “I graduated Vincentian Academy in 2015 and entered Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland.”

More than a decade later, Deacon Ryan is preparing to be ordained a Capuchin Franciscan priest on **Saturday, June 6** at Saint Augustine Church in Lawrenceville. He is most appreciative for World Day for Consecrated Life, held on **Monday, February 2**, reminding us to give thanks and pray for religious sisters, brothers, priests and those discerning vocations. The religious from Divine Grace Parish also include **Sr. Patricia Meyers**, formerly on staff, who is a Sister of the Holy Spirit.

“For me, it is a day of witness,” Deacon Ryan said. “As a Capuchin, our brown habit is very visible. It’s a reminder that there is something more to life.”

Deacon Ryan currently serves at Our Lady of the Mountains Parish in Cumberland, MD, where the Capuchins staff two churches and maintain the Shrine of Saints Peter and Paul. A typical day begins with 6:30 am meditation six days a week, morning prayer, Mass, then breakfast. During the day he works in the parish office, helps out at their food pantry, does baptism prep, teaches OCIA classes, preaches at funeral Masses, leads wake services, and presides at burial services.

Later there’s evening meditation, evening prayer, dinner, and fellowship with the other five Capuchins living in the friary.

How can single Catholic men be open to God perhaps calling them to discern a priestly vocation? “Prayer is the most important thing,” Deacon Ryan said. “We need to have a relationship with Christ through prayer, Holy Mass, confession, and reading Scripture.”

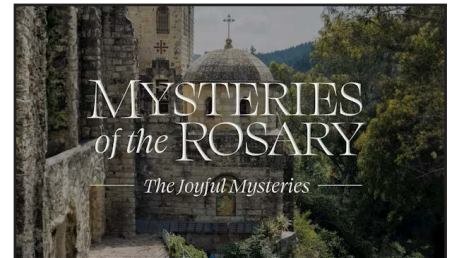

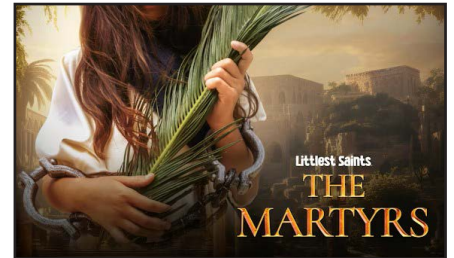
The Presentation

WELCOMING THE STRANGER

Divine Grace parishioners and visitors in a January 22 presentation learned how to welcome the stranger in ways that are based on Catholic social teaching. **Jacob Williamson** with the diocese noted that migration is not a left-right issue; rather, it's the Gospel. All people are made in the image and likeness of God and have a right to migrate to support themselves and their families. At the same time, sovereign nations have the right to control their borders. **Sr. Janice Vanderneck** of Casa San Jose said they are focused on protecting the dignity of immigrants receiving threats and experiencing aggression from federal agents. She noted that 70% of immigrants in detention have no criminal records, and they are 60% less likely to be incarcerated than people born in the U.S.

Unpacking the Word

— Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13 —

Zephaniah is one of the twelve minor prophets, so called because their writings are much shorter than those of the four major prophets. He was the great-great grandson of King Hezekiah, and his career as a prophet coincided with the reign of his third cousin, King Josiah, in the late seventh century B.C. (see Zephaniah 1:1). This is the only Sunday in the three-year cycle of readings that we read from Zephaniah during Mass, and this selection comes mainly from the third and final section of his short book where he presents oracles of restoration.

Zephaniah has a lot to say about the Day of the Lord, a phrase referring to a new intervention by God in the world during which wickedness is punished and righteousness is rewarded. Historically, he is pointing ahead to the destruction of Jerusalem at the hands of the Neo-Babylonian Empire in the 580's B.C., the subsequent seventy-year exile in Babylon, and finally the return of a small and humbled number of Jews to rebuild the Temple. Though the people have been humbled for their sins and the sins of their nation, they also experienced the blessing of being poor in spirit, of mourning, of meekness, and of total reliance on the Lord who promises to be their refuge.

As a Church throughout western culture, we have been humbled and brought low. For decades, the Church's cultural influence has waned significantly. Our own Diocese has reorganized again, and some church buildings have closed. In the face of such a humbling, the Spirit tells us today through the Prophet Zephaniah to "seek the Lord [...] seek justice, seek humility." He promises that there will be a remnant at the core of the restoration. This remnant will be "humble and lowly," which does not refer to social status as much as it does to an interior attitude toward God. It is the meekness and humility of heart that Jesus models (see Matthew 11:29) and calls us to in the Beatitudes.

We can look around our parish or the Church at large and see plenty of things we wish were different. We can even fall into the trap, as I do too often, of thinking we know what needs to happen to "fix" the Lord's Church. Yet it is humility and holiness that will serve the restoration more than high ideals. The Church, our parish, needs saints, not CEOs. This week the Spirit is challenging us to consider whether we are part of the remnant at the core of the restoration or if we are standing in its way.
