World Day of the Sick

Our Lady of Lourdes refers to the Marian apparitions reported by 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, France, with first apparition on February 11, 1858. She called herself the Immaculate Conception and appeared 18 times to Bernadette, the last one on July 16, which is our parish feast day of Our Lady, Mother of Divine Grace. Lourdes is a major pilgrimage for those who are ill, with the Church recognizing 70 specific miracles. **Wednesday, February 11** is celebrated as the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and the World Day of the Sick.

Blessing of Couples

Saint Valentine, a bishop in the early Church who was martyred, is celebrated on **Saturday, February 14**. We will bless all couples next weekend at Mass. We pray for happy, healthy, and holy marriages.

Oldenski Hall Update

As you know, there has been a focus group meeting to discuss renovation of Oldenski Hall using the Church Alive funds that Saint Ferdinand raised. We recently hosted a town hall meeting to discuss tentative plans. We have secured HDG Architects to begin the conception design of the space. This is a reputable firm who has completed many diocesan projects and is familiar with church-related work. We hope to have these designs by Easter. We will display them in the church narthex for people to review. Once we have further designs, we will open the project for three contractors to bid on the work. We do not anticipate any construction until Spring 2027 at the earliest. I will keep you informed as this process unfolds.

Annual Parish Appeal

Next weekend, members of the Parish Finance Council will address the congregation after the homily at each Mass as the Annual Parish Appeal gets underway for 2026. Thank you for your support of this appeal, which assists the formation of seminarians, retired priests, ministry at nursing homes, colleges and prisons, provides funding for

the disabled, and many more ministries. Parish Appeal is launched every calendar year; however, the assessment for each parish follows the fiscal year (July 1 through June 30). Our assessment is \$500,000 for the 2025-26 fiscal year. So far, we have received \$287,041 as of December 31, 2025. For the 2025 calendar year, we received \$721,600, exceeding our assessment; therefore, we are able to keep excess funds for parish use. Again, thank you!



LENTEN MISSION Can Help Bring Renewal



A Lenten Parish Mission is an ideal opportunity to seek a spiritual conversion, renew our faith, and deepen our relationship with Jesus. Fr. Boniface Hicks, OSB, will help guide Divine Grace parishioners in presenting a three-day Mission at Saint Ferdinand Church. A type of “spiritual spring cleaning,” Lent’s 40 days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (charity) call us to repent and remember Jesus’s death and resurrection. We are encouraged to turn to the Lord with our entire heart, meditating deeply on the Passion of Christ through the Stations of the Cross, and to pray together, strengthening our community of faith.

Fasting and abstinence are important aspects of Lent, inviting us to focus on spiritual gifts instead of earthly goods. We strive to become more like Christ, dying to sin and embracing new life in the Spirit – journeying through the self-denial of Lent to the joy of Easter Sunday.

Fr. Boniface, a Benedictine monk of Saint Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, has provided spiritual direction to many lay adults, including married couples, seminarians and consecrated religious and priests since his ordination to the priesthood in 2004. He also has extensive experience as a retreat master and teaches courses on the spiritual life, in addition to broadcasting on WAOB 106.7 FM and writing books.

The moving story in Acts 3 of Peter healing the crippled beggar at the gate of the temple is the inspiration behind the theme of this year's **Annual Parish Appeal**. When the man asked for money, Peter replied, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise and walk."

"What I Have, I Give" reminds us that God doesn't ask us to contribute what we don't possess. He invites us to offer what we can, in faith, and trust that He will multiply it.

Parish Appeal, which kicks off next weekend, supports essential ministries diocesan-wide, Catholic education, seminary formation, and administrative services for parishes across six counties. Funds raised over the parish assessment remain at the parish.

Retaking the Disciple Maker Index Survey

As mentioned in previous bulletins, the Disciple Maker Index survey will be available beginning on **Ash Wednesday, February 18** and will run through **March 29**. It's the same survey parishioners took in Lent of 2023.



The primary purpose of this second assessment is to measure the impact and growth of our evangelization efforts. The results will enable our parish leadership to review and revise plans in light of Bishop Eckman's vision that all parishes embrace the call to serve others. The data will help ensure that the spiritual and corporal works of mercy remain at the heart of our parish community.

The survey again will be administered primarily online by Catholic Leadership Institute. To ensure accessibility by all, paper copies are available upon request to a parish office. All responses are anonymous; Divine Grace Parish receives only aggregate results. Thanks in advance for participating.




Beloved

The Examen Prayer

Saint Ignatius believed we can find God in the flow of daily life – in every task, encounter, and happening. **The Examen Prayer** is a practice of discerning, not about a specific decision, but about God every day. Please join us for an introduction to the Examen Prayer. This online session will include silent Scripture-based prayer, followed by an opportunity to share in a group reflection.

Unpacking the Word

— Isaiah 58:7-10 —

How are we supposed to be the light of the world? The Prophet Isaiah gives us some very practical steps that later tradition will call the corporal works of mercy: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked. Many of us practice these things regularly through various outreach programs at our parish or on our own. If you are a parent of young children, you practice them multiple times each day in your home.


Why does the Lord need to tell us to share, shelter, clothe, and not turn our backs on our own? These things are obvious, right? Yet there is something in our fallen hearts that make “oppression, false accusation, and malicious speech” far too easy, even toward our “own,” whomever they may be. The antidote to this gloom that we all experience within ourselves is practicing the corporal works of mercy. The Lord says through Isaiah that when we do these things, “your wound,” that ache inside your heart, the gloom that too easily creeps in, “shall quickly be healed.”

There is a twofold luminous result to practicing the corporal work of mercy. First, “your light shall break forth like the dawn,” that light that Jesus said you must let shine before others so that they can glorify the Lord. Second, “the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard,” your protection, as the glory cloud was for Israel during the Exodus (see Exodus 14:19). There is an interesting cycle at play here. We do good so that others glorify the Lord, and his glory in turn protects us as a rear guard.

The Responsorial Psalm is meant to help us react and respond to the First Reading. This week, it is a clear and appropriate response. It is a metaphysical truth that “the just man is a light in the darkness.” Acting justly, in accordance with the works of mercy, will make “your light break forth like the dawn.” What exactly is your light? It is the light of Christ that you received in Baptism, symbolized by the baptismal candle being lit from the Easter Candle. When we feed, shelter, and clothe, we act like Jesus. We conform ourselves to the way he lived. We allow him, the Light of the World (see John 8:12), to shine through us. In a way that surpasses the purely physical, the just person is a light in the world.

Today, the Spirit calls us to glow brighter, to show greater love through concrete, corporeal actions. The Lord wants to heal our wounded hearts, to be our rearguard. The remedy, as always, is to live more like Jesus.

1 You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.


