Annual Parish Appeal

This weekend members of the Parish Finance Council will address us about the importance of the Annual Parish Appeal. Each household will be getting a letter from me with information of how you can support the campaign. Our assessment from the diocese is \$500,000. Thank you for your support.

The Holy Season of Lent

The Lenten season is the fitting time to climb the holy mountain of Easter. Lent has a double character - namely, preparing catechumens (the unbaptized) for initiation into the Church, and for all Catholics to prepare for the celebrations of the Paschal Mystery. At the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday, we renew our baptismal promises and recommit ourselves to Jesus Christ. Catholics are encouraged to examine their conscience and celebrate the sacrament of penance. Let's make this a great Lent in which we renounce sin and evil and embrace the Gospel of Christ.

The Disciplines of Lent

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 18** and concludes with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on **Holy Thursday, April 2**. The Ash Wednesday Mass and Service schedule can be found on page 6 of the bulletin. It is a day of fasting and abstinence. Those age 14 and older are to abstain from eating meat. All between the ages of 18-59 are to practice fasting which permits one regular meal and two small meals. Those with medical conditions in which fasting may be harmful are dispensed, however, they should perform another act of penance. The practice of abstaining from meat applies to all Fridays in Lent. These customs reflect our communion amongst Catholics and our commitment to grow in holiness as we begin the season of Lent.

Ash Wednesday

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return!" These are the words spoken as ashes are imposed on our foreheads. The palms that were blessed last year on Palm Sunday are burned and the ashes are used on Ash Wednesday. The triumph by which Jesus entered Jerusalem with the people throwing palms at His feet now emphasizes the triumph of Jesus' Mercy on us as we enter the season of Lent.

Stations of the Cross

Spiritually walk with Jesus in our suffering as we pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday of Lent at 7:00 pm in all three of our churches. Additionally, the Stations will be prayed Fridays after the 8:30 am Mass at Saint Ferdinand, and at 2:30 pm at Saint Gregory with the school students.

Goodbye Alleluia

From Ash Wednesday until the Easter Vigil, we will not sing the Alleluia before the Gospel since we are in a season of penance. Our Christian joy remains as always; however, our need to repent refocuses our joy on the mercy of God.

Putting God First in their Marriage



Divine Grace parishioners **Andrew and Marla Welch** grew up Catholic and benefited from the witness of their parents and grandparents, along with attending a marriage preparation weekend, but it's taken them time to fully appreciate what is meant by a sacramental marriage.

“My understanding has grown over time, more deeply,” Andrew says. “I’ve found that you have to make sure that your life is ordered properly – love of God, love of spouse, and love of children.”

The Welch’s married in 2014 and are busy raising five young daughters. They joined many other couples in celebrating **National Marriage Week**. For Catholics, special emphasis is placed on living a sacramental marriage, a lifelong covenant between a baptized woman and man in which God’s grace strengthens them to grow in holiness and seek heaven.

“God’s love is revealed in our children,” Marla says. “I feel His graces, especially on hard days.” A visible sign of Christ’s love for His people, a sacramental marriage is a permanent bond symbolizing God’s steadfast commitment. “Living an authentic marriage in the world today is a type of evangelization,” Andrew says. “If people see you joyful with your spouse and children, they might say, ‘I’m interested in that.’”

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops notes that the observance of National Marriage Week is an opportunity to focus on building a culture of life and love that begins with supporting and promoting marriage and the family. “We have made an emphasis on cutting out more worldly things from our lives,” Andrew says. “The Church provides direction and guideposts.”

Andrew and Marla pray the Rosary together and participate in a marriage enrichment program in a nearby parish. “Being connected with other Catholic couples has been so fruitful for us, hearing their encouragement, good guidance and wisdom,” Marla says. “We also do weekly check-ins with each other – where we are, what do we need to work on in prioritizing our marriage.”







Unpacking the Word

— Sirach 15:15-20 —

Sirach is a summation of the Israelite wisdom tradition after the convergence of Jewish piety and Greek philosophy that took place in the centuries immediately before Jesus' birth. Similar to Proverbs before it, Sirach is a large anthology of practical knowledge for successful living, things that more often than not hold true in life. Its author, Jesus ben Sira, arranged the material into poems, moral exhortations, and wise sayings. The early Church used this book extensively in moral catechesis, often calling it "Ecclesiasticus" or "the Church book."

This selection focuses on human freedom and the doability of following the Lord's commands. The message is that righteousness actually is possible, and in many ways is simply a matter of choosing to act rightly. You and I actually can be saints. Sirach maintains that keeping the commandments is the surest way to a full and happy life while violating them ruins our lives and those around us. He echoes the great Mosaic covenant where the Lord lays before Israel life and death, blessings and curses, and urges them to choose life (see Deuteronomy 30:15-20). Righteousness certainly does not depend only on human effort—that was the error of the heretic Pelagius who taught that we do not need grace and save ourselves by our own efforts—but human effort, human choice, is required to participate with the grace that God gives us to act rightly. That is the Spirit's main point through Sirach: You can do it!

Sirach goes even further though: "To none does he give license to sin." It is far too easy for us to rationalize our own sin, to explain it away with our laundry list of mitigating circumstances. But having a bad day, not getting enough sleep, having a difficult conversation, our

baggage and woundedness from our past, all of it contextualizes what still amounts to a sin if we choose not to act rightly. While it is true that our personal culpability may be diminished by certain circumstances (see Catechism no. 1754), circumstances do not give us license to act unjustly, and they do not make a wrong action right. The circumstances do not matter as much as what we make of them, of the choices we make within them. The Spirit is reminding us that morality still boils down to personal choices, and "whichever he chooses [life and death, good and evil] shall be given him."

Acting rightly is difficult in the same way that exercise or personal finance or healthy eating or parenting are difficult. They all require the will to do something and then just doing it over and over and over again, in all circumstances. The habit of acting rightly, done almost without thought after immense repetition, the Church calls virtue, whereas the habit of acting wrongly almost without thought she calls vice. Like beginning a workout routine or a personal savings plan, habitually choosing the good begins with smaller choices. "If you choose you can keep the commandments," and if you do not choose you likely will not. This week, the Spirit is inviting us to examine our lives for the places where we are not habitually choosing to keep the commandments (our vices) and choose to act differently, to choose to grow in virtue. But do not forget to pray for the grace to follow through.




