5th Sunday of Lent

With Easter two weeks away, the Church continues to encourage all of us to continue our Lenten journey with discipline, focus, and intentionality. The new life that is waiting for us in the Resurrection is confessed by Martha in the gospel this weekend but only after her grief in the death of her brother, Lazarus. When Jesus arrives, their conversation gives Martha the opportunity to confess: “Yes, Lord, I have come to believe you are the Messiah.” Then Jesus brings Lazarus back from the dead. May our faith continue to be strengthened during this holy season of Lent.

Annunciation of the Lord

This Wednesday we celebrate the great mystery of Mary's pregnancy with the announcement from the Archangel Gabriel of the conception of her child by the Holy Spirit. Her response – let it be done to me according to your will – is an act of faith to trust in the will of God. What is God asking of each one of us regarding how we live our Christian faith?

Next Sunday – Palm Sunday

If you have not yet returned your palms from last year, please do so using the bins in the narthexes. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday as we walk with Our Lord in the final moments of his earthly life before the Resurrection. Consider wearing something red, the color of vestments that the priest and deacon wear.

Sacrament of Penance

Confession times are as usual this week but we will also hear confessions on Holy Week Monday at 7:00 pm at Saint Ferdinand, Holy Week Tuesday at 5:00 pm at Saint Gregory, and 5:00 pm on Holy Week Wednesday at Holy Redeemer.

All of the Holy Week and Easter liturgy times are listed in the bulletin. Consider inviting a family member or friend who is a non-practicing Catholic, or any person who does not observe any religion to experience the beauty and holiness of the sacred liturgy.

MOVEMENT
OF THE** *Holy Spirit*

Adults preparing to enter the Church through Divine Grace Parish at the Easter Vigil are part of a larger trend across the nation of renewed growth in the Catholic faith.

Since our parish was established in July 2022, in addition to infant and child baptisms, we have welcomed 59 new members through OCIA – the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, according to **Jason Gawaldo**, Director of Evangelization & Catechetical Ministries.



“I think it’s a movement of the Holy Spirit,” Jason said. “Inquirers have lots of ‘why’ questions about Scripture and the Church’s rituals. I love asking them, why Catholic and why now?” Jason recently led the OCIA class through parts of the Mass at Saint Gregory Church in one of their weekly meetings that encompass prayer, scripture study, and instruction on Catholic teaching for the unbaptized.

OCIA is for adults who are not baptized, baptized in another Christian tradition, or baptized Catholics who have not received Confirmation and Holy Communion. It was formerly called RCIA – the word “Rite” was changed to “Order” to reflect a more comprehensive preparation process and a lifelong, ongoing journey of conversion.

The four stages of OCIA begin with a period of inquiry, then the Catechumenate which is a formal study of the faith, prayer, and community involvement. Stage three of purification and enlightenment coincides with Lent and includes the Rite of Election and concludes with the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Mystagogy is the post-Easter period where new Catholics deepen their understanding of the mysteries and integrate into the parish community.

Nationally, about 160,000 adult Americans entered the Catholic Church in 2025, compared to annual conversions that had fallen to 70,000 in 2020. Data from the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate, the Pew Research Center, and the Vatican show that more people are now joining the Church than leaving. For someone considering it, Jason offers a suggestion. “Don’t be afraid of giving someone a gentle nudge,” he said. “Initially it’s not a commitment, but a chance to explore.”







What I Have, I Give

Unpacking the Word

Jason Gawaldo, Director for Evangelization & Catechetical Ministries

— Ezekiel 37:12-14 —

Ezekiel's prophetic ministry occurred during the final years of the Davidic Monarchy in Judah and throughout the early years of the Babylonian exile, roughly around 630-570 B.C. His message was highly liturgical, his actions often bizarre, and his visions vivid and at times shocking, heavily influencing the *Book of Revelation*. Ezekiel 37 is part of a broader section (chapters 33-39) focused on the Lord's promises of a New Exodus, a New Heart for God's people, a New Creation, and a New Kingdom. It sounds a bit like the God who is "making all things new" (Revelation 21:5).

The context for all this newness is things (and people) getting older. The Exile was wearing on, and the elders were getting older and starting to realize that they may never witness the fulfillment of God's promises tied to the Holy Land. It might just be their lot in life to be alive during one of the lowest points in the history of God's people. Would God even keep that promise? Could he even keep it? In this context, the Lord delivered a forceful message: I will keep my promises even if I have to drag you out of your graves to do so! No low point in history, no persecution, not even death can stand in the way of the Lord's purposes.

While Ezekiel's words were a very poetic way of describing national restoration in the Promised Land, it has never escaped notice that the text explicitly describes a bodily resurrection. And when Jesus literally opened Lazarus' grave and had him rise from it, many people began to know that he is God-in-flesh, just like the Lord promised through Ezekiel centuries before. Death is not the end of God's promises, not for Lazarus, not for Jesus, not for the widow's son (see Luke 7:11-17), not for Jairus' daughter (see Mark 5:22-42), not for Tabitha (see Acts 9:36-38). And not for you either.

As St. Paul pointed out to the Romans, "whatever things were written before were written for our instruction" (15:4). These are not once-upon-a-time promises; these are here and now promises. We are in exile in a culture increasingly hostile to and intolerant of Jesus and his Church, a New Babylon if you will. Against that, it can seem like God's promises are just a fairytale. And what good can really be done by giving up Netflix for forty days? Yet the Gospel still has the power to transform hearts and minds, nations and cultures, and even your home.

Is your Lenten discipline getting old? Is the weariness of life weighing you down? Do you sometimes wonder if the Lord will actually keep his promises or if they all are just spiritualized for some mystical hereafter? This week, the Lord is reminding us that he wants to restore our life, to breathe his own Spirit into us, to revive our dry bones. The Lord has promised, and he will do it, even if he has to drag you from your grave. Just ask Lazarus.



Rosary of the Seven Sorrows of Mary



When in your life have you experienced true sorrow?

God often does His best work in the midst of our greatest grief. It is when our hearts are broken that God's grace can reach us more fully. It's true for each of us. And that was true for Mary, too.

Mary knew from the very beginning that being Jesus' mom wouldn't be easy. It would mean that she had enemies. It would mean that she would watch her son die. It would mean a life of sorrow.

There were seven intense moments of suffering in Mary's life. The Seven Sorrows Rosary is a powerful way to reflect on the incredible work God did through Mary's suffering – and can work through your suffering too.

Rather than reflecting on the typical five mysteries of the Rosary, the Seven Sorrows Rosary invites us to pray seven decades dedicated to the seven most impactful moments of suffering in Mary's life:

1. The Prophecy of Simeon
2. The Flight into Egypt
3. The Loss of Jesus in the Temple
4. Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary
5. Mary Stands at the Foot of the Cross
6. Mary Receives the Dead Body of Jesus
7. The Body of Jesus is Placed in the Tomb



By reflecting on these moments in Mary's life, she will teach us to prayerfully endure the struggles in our own lives and to comfort others when they suffer. Whether you've prayed the Seven Sorrows Rosary before or not, Lent is the perfect time to get started.




