6th grade Faith Formation at Home addresses who God is, who we are in relation to God, and how to have a living relationship with God through prayer. The Catholic Vision of Love sections address the concept of vocation and what it means to be a woman or a man. The outline of the video titles are below. We encourage parents to watch these videos ahead of time or with your child so that you can discuss the videos with them.

There are Parent, Participant, and Leader guides under each video session on Formed.org that includes discussion questions, Bible verses, quotes, etc. that you can use to help facilitate discussion with your child. You do not have to use these discussion resources, but they may be helpful.
