

Thursday, March 25th Feast of the Annunciation

The "Magnificat" or "Canticle of Mary" is taken from the Gospel of Luke 1:46-55

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord,
my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for He has
looked with favor on His lowly servant. From this day
all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty
has done great things for me, and holy is His name.

He has mercy on those who fear Him in every
generation. He has shown the strength of His arm,
he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has
cast down the mighty from their thrones,
and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry
with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.
He has come to the help of his servant Israel
for he remembered his promise of mercy,
the promise he made to our fathers,
to Abraham and his children for ever.



“For centuries, March 25 has been celebrated by Catholics as the “Feast of the Annunciation.” Mary’s fiat, “I am the servant of the Lord. Let it be done to me as you say,” brought our Savior into the world. As the first disciple of Christ, Mary shows us that we must listen to and do God’s will. Prayer and action therefore go hand in hand. As followers of Christ we must make time to talk to and listen to Him in prayer. Examining all that we do, or simply “living” in the light of our prayer, is essential. Living with a heart open to God’s will has enormous implications. Different people will realize that God calls them to different things. For an adolescent, it may mean resisting peer pressure to take part in drinking or unchaste activity. For the single adult, it could require offering personal time in service of a needy person. A businessman may find that honesty and fairness requires a certain course of action. A married couple could realize that they should have another child. A frightened pregnant woman may understand that she needs to ask for help to resist the temptation to abortion. The sick person might have to accept his illness and join his suffering to that of Christ. Doing God’s will is not always easy. We usually have our own plans for our lives. It is good to have plans, but never at the expense of our growth in relationship to God. Like Mary, we must trust that God’s will is the best for us and our world. Let us follow the example of Mary and call upon her to help us open our hearts to say “yes” to God!” - USCCB

The Holy Triduum

Holy Thursday liturgy recalls the Last Supper and the First Eucharist, where Jesus models for us how to serve when he washes the feet of his apostles. It also commemorates the establishment of the priesthood. At the end of the liturgy, the sanctuary is stripped clean in preparation for the most somber of feasts, Good Friday.

Good Friday is the only day of the year on which Mass is not celebrated; the Holy Communion that is given out has been consecrated on Holy Thursday and kept in the tabernacle for adoration. The Good Friday liturgy, in its solemnity, invites us to enter deeply into the passion of Our Lord. It is a somber remembrance of Jesus’ crucifixion and death on the cross. The church is bare on Good Friday, the altar is stripped of ornamentation and the tabernacle left open and empty.

Holy Saturday—Easter Vigil is the final day of preparation for Easter. It is the restoration of the early Church’s tradition as the great celebration of adult baptism and confirmation. It is the high point of the Church liturgical year. The Vigil begins in the darkness (outside) and the procession of candlelight that enlivens the church reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world who has conquered all darkness and death. The Paschal candle that is lit at the Easter Vigil will remain in the church throughout the year as a sign of Christ’s death and resurrection.

Liturgy Lessons Part 6



Where is the Gloria?

Following the Penitential Rite we are accustomed to praying the Gloria, the words sung by the angels on the night of Christ's birth. Accompanying the angels and saints in heaven we proclaim God's glory, thanking Him for sending His Son to earth to take away our sins, who now reigns with Him in glory in Heaven with the Holy Spirit. There are two liturgical seasons where the Gloria is omitted: Advent and Lent. We omit the Gloria during Advent because we are awaiting the birth of Jesus and are reminding ourselves of the time the Jews waited for the Messiah to come. Similarly, we omit the Gloria during Lent because we are fasting in reparation for our sins and awaiting the Resurrection of Jesus.

Lent is a time of reflection, gratitude, alms giving, fasting, and prayer. St. Mary's would like to recognize Birthright for Lenten giving. This past year has been a lot. All of us have felt the effects of COVID-19, some more than others, but we have all been impacted. Birthright is extremely low on all necessary items. These items will go to women and children in our community. Pick up a card from the display, purchase the items and bring them back placing in the bassinet, mail or drop off at Birthright.

A GUIDE TO CONFESSION

1. Confession is anonymous, that is, behind a screen.
2. After the priest greets you in the name of Christ, make the sign of the cross. Then you say: "Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been (state how long) since my last confession. These are my sins."
3. Tell your sins simply and honestly to the priest. You might even want to discuss the circumstances and the root causes of your sins and ask the priest for advice or direction.
4. Listen to the advice the priest gives you and accept the penance from him. Then make an Act of Contrition for your sins.
5. The priest will then dismiss you with the words of praise: "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good. The priest will then conclude with: "The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go in peace." And you respond by saying: "Thanks be to God."
6. Spend some time with Our Lord thanking and praising Him for the gift of His mercy. Try to perform your penance as soon as possible.

AN ACT OF CONTRITION

Oh my God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In His name, my God, have mercy. Amen.



