



Focus on the Statues in St. Mary's Church

MADONNA OF THE STREETS

The original painting called the 'Madonna of the Streets' was by the Italian artist Roberto Ferruzzi. Ferruzzi entered the portrait in a prestigious 1897 exhibition in Venice. While he later denied there was any intention of portraying the Blessed Mother, he provocatively titled the work "Madonnina," or "Little Mother." This endearing image reflects both the vulnerability and kindness of a young mother. Perhaps that is why it's among the most popular religious items, sought after by first-time mothers. "This particular image became part of a tradition in Italy. Mothers place a copy of it, in their child's crib. Blue for boys and pink for girls." The name of the young woman is believed to be Angelina Cian. She never outright expressed her role in the world-renowned image, but one of her daughters, who was a nun, discovered it years later. Documents provided indisputable proof that Sister Angela Marie Bovo's mother was the young girl in "Madonnina." In addition, the baby in the painting was identified as the girl's brother Giovanni, who was one year old at the time. Ferruzzi had been in Venice when he noticed the girl with the baby— she was draped against the cold and holding the child close to help them both stay warm. It was obvious that Angelina, then 11, was too young to be the baby's mother. But she displayed an arresting maternal gentleness that was irresistible to the artist. The original print was eventually lost. The town of Luvigliano, where the artist passed away is now trying to recover it. Until that day comes, the search for the iconic image that so many people link to Our Lady and a young mother's love will continue.






Why the Priest Washes His Hands

After blessing the offerings at the altar, and before beginning the Eucharistic Prayer, you will see that the priest washes his hands. It is not for physical cleanliness, but rather it expresses the desire for interior purification as the priest prays, "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin." St. Cyril of Jerusalem explains, "You have seen then the Deacon who gives to the Priest water to wash, and to the Presbyters who stand round God's altar. He gave it not at all because of bodily defilement; it is not that; for we did not enter the Church at first with defiled bodies. But the washing of hands is a symbol that you ought to be pure from all sinful and unlawful deeds; for since the hands are a symbol of action, by washing them, it is evident, we represent the purity and blamelessness of our conduct. Did you not hear the blessed David opening this very mystery, and saying, I will wash my hands in innocency, and so will compass Your Altar, O Lord? The washing therefore of hands is a symbol of immunity from sin."



**St. Gertrude the Great,
Feast Day November 16th**

Born on January 6th, 1256 in Germany. Gertrude was sent to live at the St. Mary Monastery in Helfta at the age of 5, where she received her education and religious formation.

In 1281, the now 25 year old Gertrude, experienced the first of many visions she would have throughout her life. She would view these visions as the moment of her new birth, as they would go onto changing her life, her priorities and studies. Gertrude would go on to become known as one of the great Mystics and Theologians of the 13th century. Through her devotion as a Benedictine Nun, Gertrude was able to develop a deep relationship with the Lord through prayer. Practicing nuptial mysticism, Gertrude viewed herself as being a bride of Christ, and was joined with Christ when she passed away on November 16th, 1301.







It is 90 minutes long. It was produced and distributed by Pure Flix Entertainment.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Although her life was short, St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207 – 1231) is recognized for her love of the poor and suffering, and as patroness of Catholic charities and the Secular Franciscan Order. The daughter of the King of Hungary, she chose a life of penance instead of leisure, which made an impact on the “commoners” she served.

St. Elizabeth married Louis of Thuringia when she was 14. Deeply in love, they had three children. Despite their wealth, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar.

After six years of marriage, her husband died in the Crusades, and St. Elizabeth was grief-stricken. Her husband's family did not look kindly upon her and mistreated her before finally throwing her out of the palace. However, the return of her husband's allies from the Crusades resulted in her being reinstated, since her son was legal heir to the throne.


St. Elizabeth joined the Secular Franciscan Order in 1228 where she cared for the poor in a hospital she founded in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. She died in 1231, but her great popularity resulted in her being named a saint only four years later.
