

The Third Sunday of Advent—Joy

The Third week of Advent symbolizes *Joy* with the “Shepherd’s Candle” reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus. This Sunday of Advent is called “Gaudete” Sunday, coming from the first word of the Latin Entrance Antiphon for this day, meaning “Rejoice” and the liturgical color is rose instead of purple. This is the Church’s way of further heightening our expectation as we draw ever nearer to the Solemnity of Christmas. Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparations is now half over and they are close to Christmas. The final days of Advent, focus particularly on our preparations for the celebration of the Nativity of our Lord (Christmas).

Advent Traditions— St. Lucy Day



December 13 is the Feast day of St. Lucy. She was a virgin and a martyr, and she is traditionally pictured holding a tray with 2 eyes. This is because she was torture for being a Christian and had her eyes torn out, but through a miracle, she could still see. She is the patroness of the blind and of those with other eye ailments. During her life it is said that she brought food and blankets to prisoners in a dark underground prison. Because she wanted to use her arms to carry as many supplies as possible, she made a wreath for the top of her head and inserted candles so she wouldn’t have to carry her candle. This is where the Santa Lucia crowns come from! Because her name is derived from the Latin word “lux” for “light,” her feast day is celebrated in Sweden as a festival of light. It includes many candles and tons of beautiful traditions.

Here’s a quick list of the top traditions for this day:

- Eating traditional Saffron buns “Lussekatter”
- Girls dressed in white robes with red sashes
- Wreaths with candles worn on girl’s heads
- Boys dressed up as “star boys” with cones on their heads
- Gingerbread house and cookie making and decorating
- Singing the Santa Lucia song

Virgin of Guadalupe, Patroness of unborn children,



St. Mary's New Confessionals

"After having reached the age of discretion, each member of the faithful is obliged to confess faithfully his or her grave sins at least once a year" (CIC 989).



"Grave sins" here means "mortal sins" so, accordingly, "serious sins" in the *Catechism* are to be understood as mortal. Keep in mind that for a sin to be mortal, three conditions must be met: grave matter, full knowledge, and complete consent (cf. CCC 1857).

A sin of grave matter which lacks either of the other conditions is not a mortal sin. In such a case the *matter* is grave but the sin is not.

The *Catechism* explains, "One commits *venial sin* . . . when he disobeys the moral law in a grave matter, but without full knowledge or without complete consent" (CCC 1862).

Liturgy Lessons 39



Acclamation in the Eucharistic Prayer

The preface ends with the words “And so, Lord, with all the Angels and Saints, we, too, give you thanks, as in exultation we acclaim:” To acclaim is to praise enthusiastically and publicly. The priest invites us to acclaim God’s name, and it truly is public as we are joined with all the angels and saints in heaven in praising God. The words come from Scripture to make up the “Sanctus” which is Latin for Holy. We are preparing ourselves to come before God, as the angels did in the visions of Isaiah and John. In Isaiah 6:3 the angels cry, “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!” In the book of Revelation 4:9-10, John writes after having a similar vision to Isaiah’s, “Whenever the living creatures give glory, honor, and thanks to him who sits on the throne and who lives for ever and ever, the twenty-four elders fall down before him who sits on the throne and worship him who lives for ever and ever.” Our faith is not private, as we are united in heaven’s praising of God.



Alma Redemptoris Mater

When praying the Divine Office, religious end the day by praying Compline, or Night Prayer. At the end of Night Prayer is sung the “seasonal marian antiphon.” We have been following this practice at Mass, singing the Marian Antiphon as a Communion Meditation Hymn. During the Easter season we sang Regina Caeli, and from Pentecost until Advent, we sang the Salve Regina. At the beginning of Advent we transition to Alma Redemptoris Mater, which continues until February 2nd, the Feast of the Purification. It’s origins go back to the same composer of the Salve Regina prayer, Herimann the Lame.



Kindergartners are growing in leaps and bounds!

Mrs. Jenkins and Mrs. Martucci are so proud of their students. It is amazing to see the growth each student is showing in their illustrations and ability to write letters and sound out words. We have been working on adding capital letters and correct punctuation to our writing.

In religion we have been continuing to practice the Our Father and, of course, learning about Advent. 
