The Fourth Sunday of Easter is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday. This is so because we always hear from Chapter 10 of John, which contains the “Good Shepherd Discourse.” In today’s gospel, Jesus says, “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.” (Jn 10:27) My sheep hear my voice. There is so much in that line! In this

Easter season, we are trying to encounter the risen Lord. One of the ways we can do this is to take time to listen to his voice. We live in a busy world. Our hearts can be filled with a lot of busyness and anxiety. The question that we face today is, “Do I take time to listen to the most important voice, that of the Good Shepherd?” We most encounter Jesus’ voice in prayer. When we pray, it is easy to do most of the talking, but what about listening? How beautiful it is to keep quiet and still and open our hearts to God’s voice. Has Jesus told us anything recently? If we want peace, hope, and joy in our lives, we must listen to the voice of God. May we take time to hear what the Good Shepherd has to say to each one of us.

In light of Good Shepherd Sunday, we rejoice in the 59th World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord’s instruction to, “Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest” (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2) While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity), secular institutes in their diversity and membership, and to the missionary life. On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, the Lord asks that we create an atmosphere that inspires vocations. Do you believe that your children think that you would be honored if the Lord called them to the priesthood or consecrated life? The priesthood and consecrated life are

incredible vocations. May our homes be places where our children can give their “YES!” to the Lord. Please pray every day for an increase in vocations and encourage vocations as best you can. A variety of resources to promote a culture of vocations can be found on the internet. We wish all mothers a Happy Mother’s Day! How blessed we are to have our moms or those motherly figures in our lives! We thank them for their love, support, wisdom, guidance, patience, encouragement, forgiveness, and enthusiasm. We also remember and pray for all deceased moms who are assisting us from above. May our heavenly Mother, Mary, intercede for all moms and may our moms look to her as a model for motherhood. Happy Mother’s Day!

and enthusiasm to the position. Please pray for them as well.

Next weekend, May 14-15, is the annual second collection for the following four charitable causes. First, Catholic Relief Services Collection, which offers support for six major Catholic agencies working on international relief and development, immigration services and resettlement, advocacy for the poor, peace, reconciliation, and justice. These agencies are: Catholic Relief Services; Migration and Refugee Services; Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc.; Justice, Peace, and Human Development; Secretariat of Cultural Diversity in the Church, and the Holy Father's Relief Fund. Second, the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, with proceeds going to seminaries, social service programs, youth ministry, pastoral centers, church restoration, and the spreading of the Gospel through mass media. Please note that this collection will assist those in Ukraine. Third, the Church in Latin America, with proceeds supporting such things as catechetical and lay leadership programs, youth ministry, evangelization programs, and formation programs for religious priests and deacons. Fourth, the Church in Africa, the fastest growing part of the Universal Church, which faces tremendous challenges including the prevalence of HIV/ AIDS, war-torn countries, extreme poverty, and rapid population growth. This holds a special place since our own Fr. Pius is from Nigeria. Please be as generous as you can.

Finally, we recently heard some extremely hopeful news with the leaking of the first draft of a Supreme Court decision that would overturn *Roe v. Wade*. It is not final, but would not such a decision be incredible news for the saving of many innocent children from abortion. An overturning of *Roe v. Wade* would not necessarily end abortion. The issue of abortion would be up to each state. Therefore, I point out just how important the election of state officials is with the possibility of *Roe v. Wade* being overturned. As we know, our state election is days away. As Catholics, we are not asked to simply consider one issue in voting. However, the most fundamental right to be alive should weigh heavily in our discernment when voting. Please pray that *Roe v. Wade* is overturned and remember your Catholic beliefs when voting.







From our Baptism Coordinator:

Information on Choosing a Godparent

According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, the role of the godfather and godmother is to be, “firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized – child or adult – on the road of Christian life.” (CCC 1255)

Thus, the role of godparents is very important. Godparents should be wonderful examples of faith to love, inspire, challenge, and pray for your child. Who comes to mind for you? Who do you trust to help lead your child into a deeper love for Jesus and the Church? Please pray about this exciting and critical choice.

In choosing a godparent:

- You can have a godmother and/or a godfather: “There is to be only one male or female sponsor of one of each.” (Canon 873). Thus, you cannot have two godmothers or two godfathers.

Requirements for a godparent:

- Must be 16 years or older
- Must have received all their Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Communion)
- Must be an actively practicing Catholic (Registered at a parish, attends Mass each Sunday and on holydays of obligation)
- Cannot be the father or mother of the one to be baptized

Requirements for a Christian Witness:

- Baptized in a non-Catholic, Christian denomination
- Can be a Christian Witness as long as there is one Catholic godparent. Christian Witness must be the opposite sex of the Catholic godparent.
- Is NOT to be a former Catholic. That is, a baptized Catholic who no longer considers himself/herself a Catholic.




