FROM FATHER TERRY

J+M+J

We hear today of Jesus sending out the seventy-two to proclaim the Gospel. (Lk 10:1-12, 17-20) Upon returning, they are happy that the demons were subjected to them through the power of Jesus' name. (17) How does Jesus respond to their success? "Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven." (20) Jesus is telling them to not get too caught up in their success. In other words, it is natural to celebrate our accomplishments, but they pale in comparison to knowing Jesus. Have you ever overly dwelt on an accomplishment or a compliment? What happens after a while? We start feeling empty. It is dangerous to base our meaning and fulfillment on our successes. Mother Teresa said, "God has not called me to be successful; He has called me to be faithful." A further point to remember is that it is God who gives us the grace to reach our goals. Thus, we can never get too caught up in ourselves, after all, it is God steering the ship. In the end, it is fine to rejoice in our accomplishments to a degree, but to always rejoice in the fact that our "names are written in heaven."

Some have asked me when the congregation will return to receiving the Precious Blood of our Lord. Bishop Zubik lifted the restriction of the faithful receiving the Precious Blood on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, which was on June 24. Thus, the Precious Blood will now be offered at Mass. This is wonderful news! Please note that if you are experiencing any signs of sickness, please refrain from reception of the Precious Blood.

On Monday, we celebrate the Fourth of July! We thank God for the gift of our freedom. What a precious gift it is. Our freedom is certainly not something to be taken for granted. It came at a great price. We remember all the brave men and women who made and still make this day possible. Let us pray for them in a special way today. As we celebrate our freedom, may we be reminded to take advantage of our independence when it comes to the Gospel. At times, we can be our own worst enemy. That is, we live in freedom, but can be afraid to proclaim the truth. Jesus Christ wants to be heard through us! We live in a world that often proclaims thoughts and ideas that are counter to the teachings of Christ. How do we respond? Our best weapon is to continue proclaiming the truth through our words and deeds, always remembering to do it in charity. The freedom

that Jesus won for us also came at a great price, his death on a cross. May we make sure to freely tell others about Jesus' victory. A wonderful way to begin the Fourth of July is by coming to Mass. We will have a Mass for Independence Day at St. Angela at 9:30 a.m. Blessed fourth to all.

Speaking of freedom, I laud the decision by the Supreme Court to reverse *Roe v. Wade*. In *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, the court said that there is no constitutional right to have an abortion. Thus, it will be up to each state to determine the legal status of abortion. Throughout the history of the Church, we have always opposed abortion. People sometimes ask me if I can further explain the Church's position. An important piece in discussing abortion is to focus on the unborn child. We believe that life begins at the very moment of conception. Thus, when we speak of the right to life, we are talking about the right of the unborn child. We are standing up for the baby in the womb. We often hear of a woman's right to do what she wants with her body. Our stance on abortion in no way attempts to hinder the rights of women. What we are trying to defend is a baby's right to have life. As we know in our society, no one has a right to take another's life. This is at the heart of our stance on abortion. All lives are sacred.

As we go forth, a lot of work needs to be done. As stated above, the issue of abortion will now be up to each state. So, what will we do to protect unborn children in Pennsylvania? Each of us has a voice. We can accomplish many things through such things as peaceful protest, daily conversations, giving to pro-life causes, and voting. Please do all that you can to make Pennsylvania a pro-life state.

A further point to keep in mind is that we will all be challenged to come up with viable alternatives to abortion. Through our volunteering and financial assistance to institutions dedicated to helping new parents, we will create an environment where people will welcome life. As a parish, we will invite you to support various causes that assist newborns.

Finally, I find it fascinating on what day the *Dobbs* case was released. It was on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Choosing life is such a powerful way to show our love for the Sacred Heart. Further, the actual date of the decision is also

significant. The celebration of the Sacred Heart is the Friday after the Second Sunday following Pentecost. This year, the Sacred Heart fell on June 24. However, June 24 is usually the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. This means that, just about every year, *Dobbs* will be remembered on June 24. The following is St. Elizabeth's words to Mary. "And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy." (Lk 1:44) St. John the Baptist *in the womb* recognized Jesus. Life begins in the womb. May we do all that we can to stand up for life. We Are Pro-Life!





Statement from Bishop David Zubik

Those of us who have worked and prayed to protect unborn children are profoundly grateful that the Supreme Court of the United States has determined that there is not a constitutional right for abortion.

In response, the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh will continue to support and encourage legislation that protects unborn children.

We support women with crisis pregnancies and young families who struggle to raise their children. We offer medical and social assistance through Catholic Charities and collaborate with additional groups that provide childcare, life skills, education, shelter and help with other basic needs.

Now, more than ever, our parishes are encouraged to participate in Walking with Moms in Need, a project of the U. S. Catholic bishops that prepare every parishioner to assist someone who needs support to carry or raise a child.

We also offer Project Rachel, a ministry of healing for women who have had abortions and those who have supported them in that decision.

We pray for many lives to be saved. It is time for a healthier national conversation about pregnancy and parenting, one that recognizes the real difficulties and creates ways to support pregnant women and to welcome children.

MA'S PANTRY

Ma's Pantry serves residents of North Versailles and East McKeesport with free food distributed twice every month. Food is distributed from Broadway Alliance Church, 1000 Broadway Street, East McKeesport from 9:30 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. on scheduled Saturdays.

First time applicants must bring:

- Proof of residence in East McKeesport or North Versailles.
- A current, government issued photo ID
- Amount and source of income
- Names and birthdates of household family members

The next distribution date is

July 9, 2022

Especially needed in July: health and beauty items (laundry and face soap, toothpaste, aspirin, shampoo, razors, shaving cream, diapers, women's sanitary supplies, deodorant, facial tissues, etc.)

MA'S PANTRY IS READY

School is out, and in case you had not noticed, food prices are rising sharply at the supermarket. Both of these facts affect the families who need food assistance and who come to MA's Pantry. Everyone is affected by the big increases in food prices. The elderly on fixed incomes and all low-income folks are hard hit. In addition, for the families with children home from school for the summer, there is another need. All the children in the East Allegheny School District receive a free breakfast and lunch. Now they have to get those at home. So, both need and the prices are up for families with school-age children. Imagine having a couple of teens home for 3 meals instead of just 1. MA's Pantry is ready. If you need help, "come and get it." Or, if you know anyone else who does, be sure to send them to us. Just for your information, the income threshold for eligibility is \$2,095 per month for 1 person and \$4,278 per month for a family of 4. Other family sizes are adjusted accordingly. July distribution dates are July 9 and 23, 9:00-11:00 am, 1000 Broadway, East McKeesport. MA's Pantry serves residents of East McKeesport and North Versailles.
