

On the second Sunday of Lent, we always hear of the Transfiguration. This may be the case because of an ancient tradition that tells us that the Transfiguration occurred 40 days before Good Friday. Being in Year C, we are given St. Luke's version of the Transfiguration. (Lk. 9:28-36) At the Transfiguration, Jesus gives us a glimpse of his heavenly glory. He is transformed before our eyes. This is what Lent is all about. To be transformed by the Lord. One of the ways that this can happen is told to us by God the Father in today's Gospel. He says of Jesus, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." (35) Listen to him! There is so much in this statement. One of the ways to change our hearts this Lent is to listen to the voice of Jesus. We can often do a lot of talking in prayer. However, how are we at listening? It takes a great deal of patience and surrendering to listen for the voice of Jesus. We live in a world that seeks instant gratification and immediate results. This is not the way of God. Why? He wants us to spend time with

him and show our love for him. Is there anything else more important? Has Jesus told us anything lately in prayer? If we did not hear actual words, has he moved us in a certain direction? This Lent, may we enter the sacred silence and hear the voice of Jesus.

As we journey through the Lenten season, those in OCIA take on a much more active role. Corresponding with Lent, they find themselves in the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. I invite you to read a detailed piece that I wrote about their sacred journey elsewhere in the bulletin.

Bishop Waltersheid will be with us next Sunday March 23 at a 2:00 p.m. Mass at St. Angela to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation upon our candidates. We have 21 candidates to be confirmed! Praise the Lord! Please keep those to be confirmed in your prayers. We are so proud of them!

PERIOD OF PURIFICATION AND ENLIGHTENMENT - by Fr. Terry

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is a process whereby those seeking to become Catholic gather to learn and grow in our faith. The journey is marked with different rites. Each of these rites gives those seeking to enter the Church an opportunity to reflect and freely choose to continue. We began meeting in September and are blessed to have 11 people in OCIA. We have four elect, Dorian Alund, Gaven Alund, Addison McKnight, and Blake Steele. They will receive Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. We have three non-Catholic candidates, Kayla Edwards, Nicholas Gieger, and Katlyn Shemak. They will make a Profession of Faith and receive Confirmation and Eucharist. We have one non-Catholic candidate, Jayson Weinberg, who due to a lack of proof of Baptism, will receive conditional Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Finally, we have three Catholic candidates, Andrew Allshouse, Kimberly Mower, and Mark Steele. Andrew will receive Confirmation and Eucharist and Kim and Mark will receive Confirmation.

Our elect and candidates are now in the Period of Purification and Enlightenment, which corresponds to Lent. In fact, the season of Lent has its origin in those preparing to enter the Church at Easter. The faithful saw the penitential practices of those preparing to enter the Church and wanted to join in. The purification and enlightenment period is a time for those in OCIA and all of us to undergo an intense spiritual preparation for Easter. To help purify the elect, the scrutinies and the presentations are celebrated during the Lenten season.

WHAT ARE THE SCRUTINIES AND PRESENTATIONS?

The scrutinies are mainly for the elect but the faithful are encouraged to join in the scrutinies to also benefit from them. We are all in need of conversion, so we join with the elect as they undergo the scrutinies. They are called scrutinies because the elect and each of us are called to scrutinize or reflect on all the good and not so good in our lives. The scrutinies include an exorcism prayer to keep the devil away from the elect. The scrutinies also include a prayer to strengthen the elect on their way to the mountaintop of Easter.

There are three scrutinies celebrated on three successive weekends. The first scrutiny, celebrated during the Third Sunday of Lent, has as its Gospel the Samaritan woman at the well. This signifies the elect coming to the baptismal waters of Jesus, who is the living water that truly quenches our thirst. The second scrutiny is on the Fourth Sunday of Lent and the Gospel chosen is the man born blind who Jesus miraculously heals. This shows that the elect are leaving any blindness behind and coming to see that Jesus is the Savior of the world. Finally, the third scrutiny, on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, has the raising of Lazarus as its Gospel. Through Baptism, the elect enter into the new life of Jesus, both now and for all eternity.

Those in OCIA are enlightened through the presentations of the Creed and the Lord's Prayer. The Creed is presented during the first scrutiny and the Lord's Prayer at the third scrutiny.

Our candidates will also receive a blessing to strengthen them as they prepare for Easter.

The scrutinies will be celebrated at the following Masses: Sunday, March 23, 11:00 a.m. (St. Angela); Saturday, March 29, 4:00 p.m. (St. Patrick); and Sunday, April 6, 9:30 a.m. (St. Patrick). Please pray for those in OCIA. We are so proud of them!

The morning will include Mass, reflections on the Sacred Heart of Jesus by Fr. Terry and Fr. Adam, Adoration, and Confessions. There is no cost. LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
- 2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18-59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
- 3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
- 4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
- 5. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by the law.
- 6. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions, or funeral wakes are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.

INDULGENCES FOR STATIONS OF THE CROSS

From Fr. Terry

There are indulgences granted for praying the Stations of the Cross. Indulgences are offered by the Church to take away the temporal punishment due to sin. That is, although confessed sins are forgiven, there remains the residue of sin that still needs removed through continued conversion. A plenary indulgence is granted to those who take part in the stations. A plenary indulgence is a full remission of temporal punishment in contrast to a partial indulgence which is a partial remission of temporal punishment. Those who are impeded from praying the stations can gain the indulgence by spending at least a half an hour in reading and prayer on the passion and death of Jesus (i.e., doing the stations at home). A plenary indulgence can also be gained by saying a prayer before a picture or image of Christ Crucified on any Friday in Lent (a partial indulgence is granted on any other day). In addition, for any plenary indulgence, the following requirements must also be met within a reasonable time: the sacrament of Reconciliation, Holy Communion, prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father, and with the soul unattached to sin. Indulgences may also be applied to the dead.


