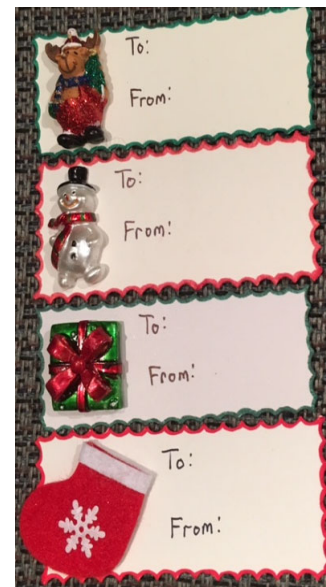

SATURDAY NOVEMBER 13th—ST. FRANCIS XAVIER CABRINI

Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ.

Refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher, she began charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy. In September 1877, she made her vows there and took the religious habit. When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named Frances prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Seven young women from the orphanage joined her.

Since her early childhood in Italy, Frances had wanted to be a missionary in China but, at the urging of Pope Leo XIII, Frances went west instead of east. She traveled with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there. She found disappointment and difficulties with every step. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. The archbishop advised her to return to Italy. But Frances, truly a valiant woman, departed from the archbishop's residence all the more determined to establish that orphanage. And she did.

In 35 years, Frances Xavier Cabrini founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes. As a child, she was always frightened of water, unable to overcome her fear of drowning. Yet, despite this fear, she traveled across the Atlantic Ocean more than 30 times. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago.



FEAST OF FAITH CONCLUDING RITES

The Prayer after Communion gives us a glimpse of the heavenly banquet, of which we have had a foretaste in the Eucharist. The concluding rites speak of what we are to do with this great gift of God. That includes the parish announcements, which are usually given following the Prayer after Communion. Believe it or not, the announcements, which are not an "official" part of the Mass, have been included in the Mass from as early as the fifth century! The deacon or the homilist—even the bishop—would announce coming liturgical celebrations and encourage the people to participate. Today's parish announcements include opportunities for prayer, service, learning, and community building. They should be succinct and should include only significant events and activities in the life of the parish. But even when they are long and tedious, the announcements (and the parish bulletin) flow out of the concluding rites of the Mass. They offer us ways to live the Eucharist, to become what we have received—the Body of Christ, living and active in our local community.

"El Señor Siempre es Fiel a su Palabra"

Las protagonistas de las lecturas de este domingo son dos viudas y, además, pobres. El punto de reflexión es qué desde su **indigencia material y por su fe en Dios**, estas dos mujeres encarnan la idea fundamental de la primera bienaventuranza: *"Dichosos los pobres de espíritu, porque de ellos es el reino de los Cielos."*

En la primera parte del Evangelio, Jesús enseña que el privilegio crea responsabilidad; es decir, si buscamos un lugar privilegiado debemos buscar no servirnos de esa posición, sino desde ahí servir a los más necesitados.

En la segunda parte del Evangelio, Jesús fija su atención en la viuda, que contribuyó con 2 monedas. Para Jesús esas dos monedas equivalen al mismo oro del cielo, convirtiéndolas en algo muy valioso. El valor de estas monedas radica en el amor que la viuda tiene a Dios y la fe que ella deposita en Él.

Algunos se preguntan con qué cantidad o porcentaje debería yo de contribuir a la obra de Dios. Pero más bien la pregunta debería ser: ¿cuánto ME reservo para mí mismo? Esto significa que lo importante no es la cantidad que se entrega sino el amor que se le pone a esa entrega. Aquella viuda no dio nada que tuviese un gran valor material, pero al dar a Dios lo que tenía, demostró su fe confiando su vida misma a Dios para que Él proveyera sus necesidades.

Cada vez que se repite una actitud ejemplar como ésta, el Señor atribuye a esas entrega el valor máximo "como el del oro del cielo," porque Él conoce la situación personal de cada uno y llega con su mirada a lo más profundo del corazón humano. Entonces, **lo importante NO ES cuánto, SINO cómo...**

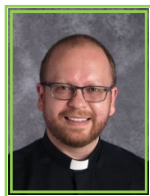

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

BAPTISM OF CHILDREN

We joyfully celebrate the Baptism of children on the third Sunday of the month at 1:30 p.m. The requirements are: to be registered in the parish and have an active participation in our parish community for at least 3 months. Register at the parish office for the Baptismal prep class, which is held on the first Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m., in the school hall. It is important to notify the parish office with the date that you will be attending the class.

FIRST COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION

MARRIAGE REQUIREMENTS

Diocese requirements include a formal engagement preparation period of at least six months before the date of the weddings and attendance in a marriage preparation program. St. Andrew requires either the bride, groom, or parents of either to be registered as parishioners for at least three months before contacting us to set a date. There are a number of additional requirements. Please contact the Parish Office for additional information.

FUNERALS

Arrangements for a funeral are usually made through the Funeral Director at a funeral home of your choice.

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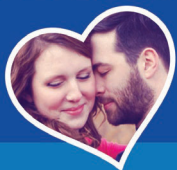
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
