

#### Opportunities to Remember, Honor and Celebrate Loved Ones

Mass Intentions: One of the greatest acts of charity is to pray for the living and the dead, and the greatest and most powerful prayer we have is the Mass, since the fruits of the Mass are the very fruits of Jesus' redemption. For that reason, all are encouraged to have Mass offered for loved ones who have died, or even for the living who have some need. This is an ancient Christian practice, and all are encouraged to take it up. With the change in our Mass schedule, and the numerous requests we receive, we are limited to the number of Mass Intentions we can offer to our parishioners. In order to give the opportunity for all parishioners to schedule a Mass intention for their loved ones and to accommodate recently deceased, we are asking Mass requests that are being said here to be limited to 5 per household for the year. The Mass offered for individuals is also limited to 5. Any more than 5 will be sent to the Office of Pontifical Mission. We have new forms to requests Mass Intentions. They are available in the narthex, the parish office and our website. A \$10 stipend, as determined by diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. Requests will not be taken over the phone. The policy will remain of one intention, per household, per month.

Memorialize loved ones with a Plaque on our Memorial Board. Small plaques are donations given between \$1,000 - \$4,999; medium plaques are donations given between \$5,000 and \$9,999, and large plaques are donations given between \$10,000 or more. Please stop by the parish office for more information.

**Opportunity for Memorialization:** Hymnal Memorials for 2019 are now available for \$10 to honor, acknowledge, remember, or celebrate a loved one.
