Sacrament of Baptism: Usually, the last Sunday of the month at 12:45 PM Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office.

Common Policy for Baptism: Parents are encouraged to call the Parish Office to receive a copy of the Parish Baptism Policy containing essential information regarding the required instruction workshop and requirements for sponsors.

Sponsor Certificates: Letters of recommendation for sponsors of the Sacraments can be issued only to active members of the Parish who are registered in the Parish and receiving the Sacraments.

Sacrament of Matrimony (Marriage)

Common Policy: It is necessary for a couple to contact the priests NINE TO TWELVE MONTHS prior to the anticipated time of the wedding. (It is recommended to contact the parish priest as soon as a formal engagement is decided.)

Sacrament of Anointing: Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

Holy Communion to the Sick: When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age, or infirmity, please call the office and arrangements will be made to take Holy Communion to the person.

ARISH TRANSFORMATION

Transformation Even in the Midst of a Pandemic

Here we are, in our 6th week of the stay-at-home order. I remember going into a very quiet Church the first Sunday (March 22) when we were not allowed to gather in large groups. It was so quiet and surreal in the Church. Little did we realize then that Holy Week Liturgies and Easter Mass would be celebrated virtually. Little did we know that the school year would end without our students coming back to their school buildings for classes. At that point in my life, I had no idea what Zoom was. I had to locate my Facebook username and password to get back into that site, since I had not been using it all that often. Now, I not only have to remember where I laid my phone; I have to remember where I put my mask (one of a few that I rotate into the wash!) if I had to take that off.

Yes, so many things have changed in the last few weeks. But one thing that has not changed is our Christian HOPE. Our parish has had to do some quick adaptations in order to reach out through the virtual world. Things were developing so quickly! In one weekend we had to bring ourselves up to speed with the various digital platforms. Livestreaming a Mass went, overnight, from being a dream to be a necessary reality. We have a daily presence on YouTube, Facebook and Instagram. I have also learned how to incorporate links into what I hope will be a regular newsletter through Constant Contact. Yes, so many changes!

But as we all know, the most important change, or transformation, has to do with our personal journey. How is the Holy Spirit nudging us to use our family time, and our private time, to grow as disciples of the Lord Jesus? A constant refrain on television ads is "We will get through this together." Yes, we will, and we Christians have an added advantage of believing that the Holy Spirit is the one who is moving us to become better members of the human family and the Christian family, even though this pandemic is not a plan that we would have devised for our own lives. We continue to huddle within the safety of our own shelters, as did the disciples that first Easter morning. We continue to fear what is out there, that could do such harm to any of us or our loved ones, this unseen viral enemy. We could give in to those dark forces, especially as we are concerned about our livelihoods and the fallout of having to shelter in place for much longer.

Are we like the disciples of today's Gospel (Luke 24:13-35) whose journey on the road to Emmaus is full of confusion? Or, are we allowing the Lord Jesus to meet us on this present journey, right where we are, and help us realize that we must walk only in the direction that gives us life – our relationship with the One who died, and rose, for our salvation?



We pray that the Church of our homes, the "Domestic Church," is what God wants it to be for us at this time in history — a place where we come to know the Lord Jesus even better, and where we are transformed into more vibrant Catholic disciples, so that when we make the great return into the world, we will be transformed into stronger and more fervent witnesses for our Savior. And, in your Domestic Church, don't forget to tune in to our livestream Masses this weekend, to gather with the rest of your parish family in the virtual world!




