Sacrament of Baptism: Usually, the last Sunday of the month at 12:45 PM Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office.

Common Policy for Baptism: Parents are encouraged to call the Parish Office to receive a copy of the Parish Baptism Policy containing essential information regarding the required instruction workshop and requirements for sponsors.

Sponsor Certificates: Letters of recommendation for sponsors of the Sacraments can be issued only to active members of the Parish who are registered in the Parish and receiving the Sacraments.

Sacrament of Matrimony (Marriage)

Common Policy: It is necessary for a couple to contact the priests NINE TO TWELVE MONTHS prior to the anticipated time of the wedding. (It is recommended to contact the parish priest as soon as a formal engagement is decided.)

Sacrament of Anointing: Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

Holy Communion to the Sick: When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age, or infirmity, please call the office and arrangements will be made to take Holy Communion to the person.



As Matthew Kelly reminds us, our prayer should start with gratitude. During this time of Thanksgiving/beginning of the Advent Season, and particularly as we are in the midst of a pandemic, here are a few Scripture passages to reflect on and allow the Holy Spirit to move within your heart:

But if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and he will be given it. Order of Worship First Sunday of Advent

Singing at public Masses: We are told that singing is one of the easiest ways for transmission of the Corona Virus, since more air is pushed from our lungs in this action. We are asked to limit singing to only the Cantor, who is in the choir loft for the entire Mass, at a substantial distance from the congregation. Music is an integral part of the celebration of Mass and we know how much you look forward to participating in our sung worship. However, prudence demands that we limit the role of congregational singing for the present time. Instead, please sing with your heart, and enjoy the fine musical leadership that always comes from the choir loft!

Homily

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, (*at the words that follow, up to and including "and became man," all bow*) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. NHM serves local people in need and provide services to include: basic needs, stability/workforce development, and youth programs.
