

Holy Communion to the Sick: When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age, or infirmity, please call the office and arrangements will be made to take Holy Communion to the person.

In addition to duties here at the parish, Father will also serve Trinity High School as their chaplain. We are really happy to welcome him to our parish, and our prayers are with him.

- Weekend Gazebo Masses: As previously announced, we will plan on offering the outdoor Mass Saturday afternoons at 4 PM and Sundays at 9:45 AM. There may be a few times, when one of the priests is on vacation or needing to assist elsewhere, that only one priest will be available for all or part of the weekend Church Masses. When this occurs, we will simulcast the indoor Church Mass on large TV screens to an outdoor area near the Church (location still to be determined). We are doing this for those who still feel more comfortable being in an outdoor social setting. Holy Communion will be brought by EMHCs during the Rite of Communion.

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she might get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The

girl, a child of twelve arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat. The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Homily

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.
