

We were delighted to host the Mobile Ag Ed Science Lab again this year for our K-8 students thanks to the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau which provided classes with an agricultural lesson and materials to complement the

lessons. Students in the various classes were "introduced to the scientific method, learned about the need for alternative growing methods and created their own hydroponic growing system, traced all the parts of a pizza back to the natural resources from the farm

needed to produce them, experimented to decide if petroleum or soybean-based crayons produce the brightest color, discovered several of the ways farmers protect the environment and natural resources, examined the environmental impact of two packing foams: Styrofoam (made from petroleum) and Eco foam (made from corn), learned about beneficial and harmful insects, conducted various tests to develop an understanding of the properties of chocolate that are essential to chocolate production, and conducted an experiment to extract DNA from a banana and discovered the possibilities biotechnology can provide."
