

## Just in time for All Saints and All Souls Days... Purgatory & Indulgences Explained & Appreciated

There's a classic analogy that has helped generations of Catholics. It's about a boy who is playing where he shouldn't be, and throws a ball that breaks a neighbor's window. The boy sincerely apologizes to the neighbor, and his apology is accepted. But the damage of the broken window remains.

Though not a perfect analogy, this is similar to what our faith teaches us about sin and "temporal punishment" -- the aftermath; the suffering that lingers after we have sinned and been forgiven.



If we die with venial sins unconfessed, or while still dealing with the lingering effects of forgiven sins, we believe that our loving God has

provided a path for us to still experience His everlasting love and peace. He has provided a time of "purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (CCC 1030). This is called purgatory. The

Catechism emphasizes that purgatory "is entirely different from the punishment of the damned" (CCC 1031). Purgatory is the generous act of a God who wants nothing more than for us, His beloved children, to abide in His goodness for all eternity.

The analogy continues...

The boy's friends and schoolmates gather all their savings, and offer it to help pay for the broken window. They "share the burden", as Saint Paul writes in Galatians 6:2. And their selfless, loving action makes a difference.



Similarly, we are encouraged to make an effort on behalf of the souls in purgatory. These efforts result in what are known as

indulgences. As you might expect, some efforts are more significant than others, and therefore carry more weight. Plenary indulgences, those resulting from the most effective efforts, grant relief from all temporal punishment. Partial indulgences, grant partial relief.

**Toshare** one another's (Gal 6:2)

So what makes some efforts more effective than others? A great example is right around the corner. All Souls Day is the special day on which the whole Church prays for those who have died. Joining our individual efforts to those of the whole Church elevates what is normally a partial indulgence burdens... to a plenary indulgence. In addition to meeting the "usual conditions" for all indulgences (i.e. the person has received Holy Communion, made a sacramental confession, and prayed for the intentions of the Holy Father), we believe:



A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who, 1. on any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed;

2. on All Soul's Day (or, according to the judgment of the ordinary, on the Sunday preceding or following it, or on the solemnity of All Saints), devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed.

A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who,

- 1. devoutly visit a cemetery and at least mentally pray for the dead;
- 2. devoutly recite lauds or vespers from the Office of the Dead or the prayer Eternal Rest.


