#### Personal Reflection: Deacon Kenski

Deacon Frank Kenski recently shared how grateful he is for the prayers of Saint Thomas Aquinas. They help him prepare before Mass, and give thanks after Mass. Here is how they begin:

PREPARATION FOR MASS (excerpt)
Almighty eternal God, behold, I come to the Sacrament of your Only begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, as one sick to the physician of life, as one unclean to the fountain of mercy, as one blind to the light of eternal brightness, as one poor and needy to the Lord of heaven an earth...

THANKSGIVING AFTER MASS (excerpt)

I give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, who have been pleased to nourish me, a sinner and your unworthy servant, with the precious Body and Blood of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: this through no merits of mine, but due solely the graciousness of your mercy...

Deacon is especially appreciative that these prayers are so available -- *right in our hymnal, on page 327*. He says, "I'm happy to know that it's right there in the pew. We don't need to look for anything extra. It blows my mind!"

Thanks, Deacon, for pointing us to these powerful prayers that are right at our fingertips! What a blessing for those quiet moments before Mass begins and right after Communion!



#### **REFLECT**

To a woman facing an unexpected pregnancy in difficult circumstances, adoption is sometimes felt to be worse than aborting her child. In reality, placing a child for adoption is a loving, generous, and sacrificial option that demonstrates a woman's profound, long-term motherly care. In considering and choosing whether to place her child for adoption, a mother seeks what is *best* for her child, making a selfless act of love. Still, a woman considering adoption may experience a number of conflicting emotions. It is essential that she be supported throughout and after the process, whether she decides to place her child with another loving family or to raise her child herself.

By grace, we are made children of God through adoption and can call him, "Abba, Father!" (*Rom*. 8:15). This spiritual adoption also makes us brothers and sisters in the Lord. Let us call on the intercession of our brothers and sisters in heaven—the saints! Through our united prayers, may expectant mothers making an adoption plan receive the support and care of the Christian community as they make a loving choice for their children.
