And so, with all the Angels, we praise you...

At about the midpoint of the Mass, the reality that we're worshiping with heaven is made explicit. We give thanks for "the daily effects of [God's] care" and for "the pledge of eternal life." We respond in the only way imaginable: with love and awe for the God who gives us such gifts. The priest says, "And so, with all the Angels, we praise you, as in joyful celebration we acclaim..." And then we sing, "Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts!" -- "we" being every member of our earthly congregation AND every member of heaven. What a joyful celebration, indeed!

May our awareness of this joining of heaven and earth at the Mass inspire us. And may our inspired engagement in the Mass prepare us to be transformed by Him in the Holy Eucharist. Amen!
