Dear Parishioners,

Today is the 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time, we celebrate the God who is close to us, in His word and our neighbor. As the image of the unseen God and the Good Samaritan, Christ is close to us in all life's circumstances. So, the church urges us to acknowledge the presence of God both in his word and in our neighbors.

In the gospel today a lawyer asks Jesus one of the most important questions “What must I do to inherit eternal life?” What do I have to do, in other words, to get to heaven? We don't get to heaven simply by being born. We don't get to heaven simply by being reborn in baptism as a child (unless we also die in that state). It's a choice, or more precisely, a series of choices, and the most important ones we'll ever make. It's precisely a choice to love.
