LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

To receive a letter of recommendation for a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation you must be registered members of the parish (for at least 6 months); who regularly attend Mass and receive the sacraments. Regular use of envelopes indicates attendance at Mass. Sponsors are to be Baptized, Confirmed, and if married, have done so in conformity with the laws of the Church. Adult children (18 and over) should be registered on their own. Out-of-town college students should receive a letter from their campus minister. People in the military should receive a letter from their chaplain.

Young adults who were confirmed recently and also are working, even part time, should assume their own identity in the parish by registering in their own name.

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

HOW TO HELP SOMEONE IN A TIME OF LOSS

Reaching out

There is no magic formula for dealing with a grieving person. The best way to reach out to someone will depend on your relationship with that person and where he or she is in the grieving process. And if you don't have a close relationship with the person grieving, you still might be the first person they have seen since the news of their loss. If the death just occurred, let the person know that you are saddened to hear the news. Expressions of genuine sympathy — even from acquaintances — offers the assurance that someone else cares. You will know instantly whether the grieving person wants to share the details of what happened.

Honoring Mary in Your Garden



You can see reminders of Mary the "Mother of God" in flowers and herbs growing around you. Violets are symbols of her humility, lilies her purity and roses her glory. Marigolds are Mary's Gold, clemantis the Virgin's Bower, and lavender Our Lady's Drying Plant. Many of these plants are easily grown in your own Mary garden.

Consider "Lily of the Valley" also known as Mary's Tears. It was said that when Mary wept at the foot of the cross, her tears fell to the ground and turned into the tiny fragrant blossoms of this early spring plant. The lily of the valley symbolizes Mary's Immaculate Conception and represents the purity of body and soul by which Mary found favor with God.

Reflection—Sacred scripture does not speak of your tears, Mary, as our legend does. It tells us instead that you stood by the cross and you were not alone. Other women and John were also there. We wonder at the sorrow, the bitterness, the pain of this little community standing by. Fragrant tiny white lily-bells, a thousand quiet tears bowing before the still-cold winter winds, teach me of springtime and the just beyond the stone-cold tomb.
