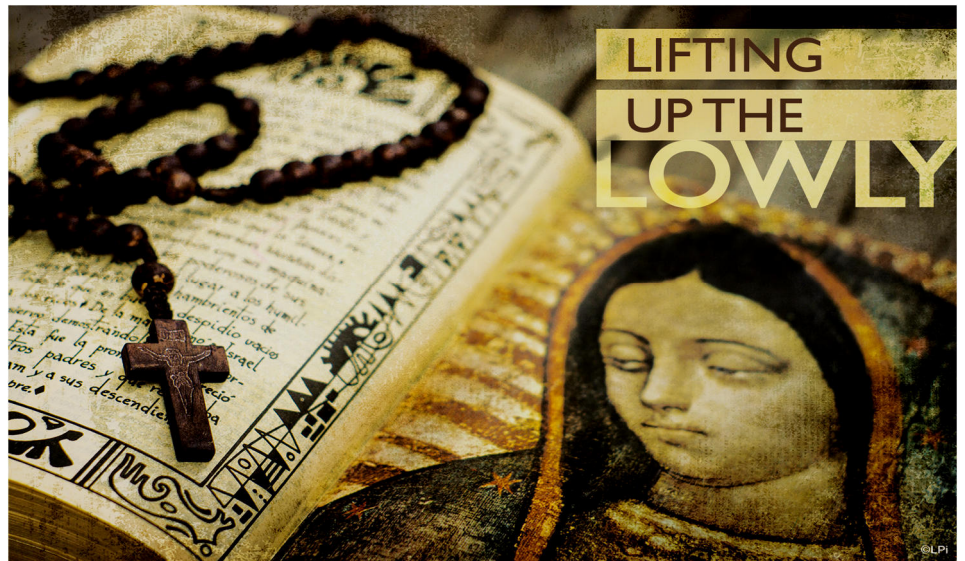
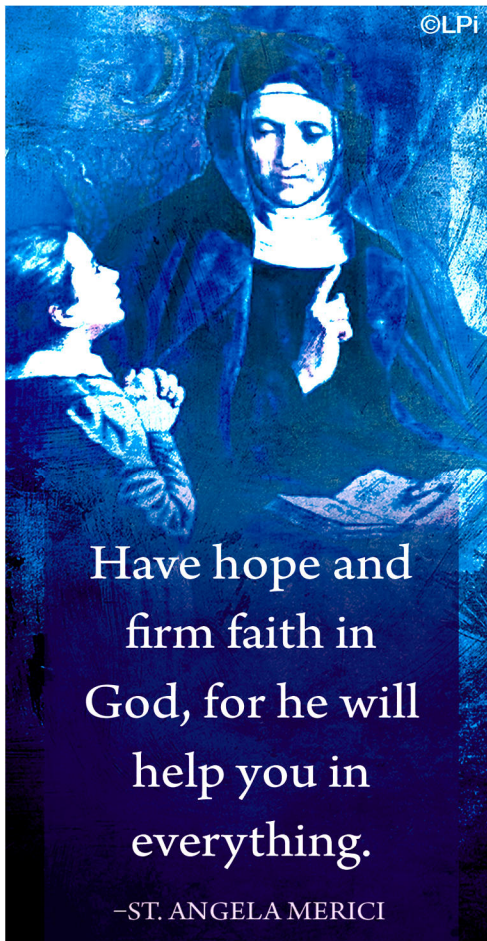

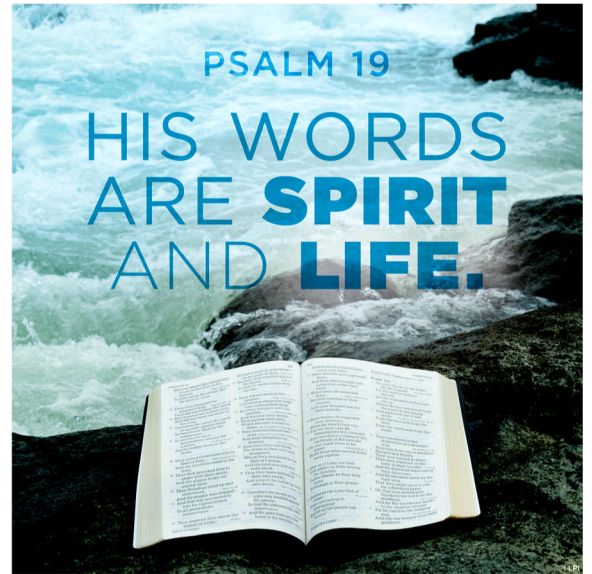
REFLECTION

Pastor's Letter

Mark, My Words:

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is the Sunday of the Word of God, instituted by Pope Francis in 2019. In the first four verses of St. Luke's Gospel which have been read to you today, you will find reason to be grateful to him. He went to a lot of trouble in order to put in a permanent form, in a written record, the essential facts concerning Christ, his words and his works, so that we "would understand (like Theophilus) the certainty of the faith in which we have been instructed.

We have a priceless gift of God in the inspired Books of the Bible. Let us show true appreciation for that gift by using it to build up a better knowledge of the Christian faith which it teaches us. There should be a Bible, or at least the New Testament, in every Christian home. It should not be an ornament on a shelf, but a fountain and source from which we can draw strength and refreshment in the daily practice of our Christian faith. Almost two thousand years ago, God's infinite goodness provided this source of strength, the "fountain of living water," for us Christians of this century. Are we grateful for his thoughtfulness? Are we nourishing our faith at this blessed fountain of his infinite wisdom and love?

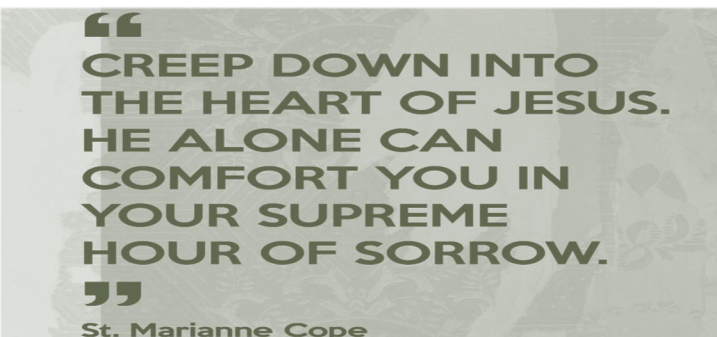

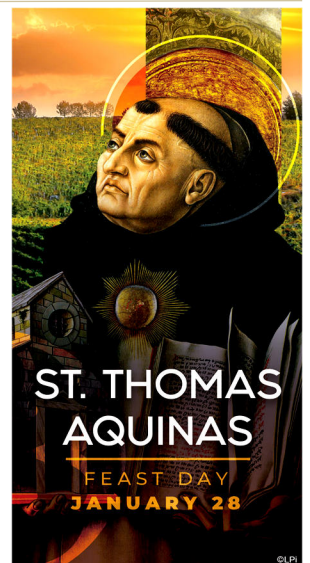
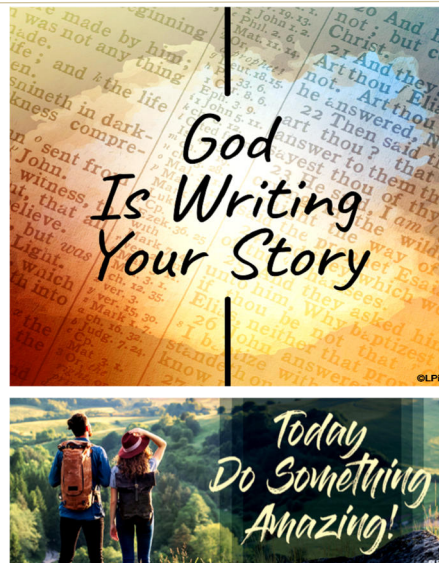

AROUND THE PARISH

UPDATED DIOCESE OF PITTSBURGH COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR CLERGY, PARISHES AND INSTITUTIONS: In a continuing commitment to care for the health, safety, and spiritual well-being of the faithful, in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Bishop David Zubik announces the following updated COVID-19 Safety Protocols. These practices are effective January 7, 2022, and are to be continued until further notice. The updates are based on the dramatic surge in community spread of the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus, and will be re-evaluated on an ongoing basis as more information from the CDC and local healthcare officials becomes available.

- As leaders in their parishes and in the community, unless extraordinary circumstances warrant otherwise, all priests and deacons must wear masks during the celebration of Mass at all times, including when preaching and at the altar.
- Everyone entrusted with the distribution of Holy Communion must wear a mask, and must also sanitize their hands immediately prior to distribution. Care must be taken not to directly touch the communicant, especially if distributing on the tongue. If contact is made, the person distributing Holy Communion must re-sanitize their hands before continuing.
- All Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, servers, greeters, ushers, lectors, and cantors must wear a mask. In addition, faith formation leaders, catechists, and those who visit the sick or homebound must wear a mask.
- Choir members are to be masked at all times.
- The presentation of the gifts is suspended until further notice.
- As already directed, the practice of shaking hands to offer the Sign of Peace is suspended until further notice.
- As also previously directed, those attending Mass are urgently encouraged to wear masks, regardless of vaccination status. Based on their age, health history, and family considerations, parishioners must make prudent decisions regarding getting vaccinated, wearing a mask, and staying home if not feeling well. As a reminder, anyone who is sick, feels they are at risk, or is a primary caregiver, as well as those who have serious anxiety about being part of a large group at this time are excused from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass (CCC #2181)
- It is strongly recommended that any parish events outside of Holy Mass are to either be cancelled, rescheduled, or be held virtually.
- Livestream Mass options are to continue so that we may serve those who are not able to come to Mass in-person.

As we begin 2022 and look with hope to a New Year filled with God's continued blessings, Bishop Zubik asks each of us to please join with him in praying for an end to the spread of COVID-19, and for health and happiness of all.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION

Confirmation Meeting for 8th Grade Confirmation Families: Due to the updated diocesan COVID policy, the meeting on the Sacrament of Confirmation for both parents/guardians and 8th Grade Confirmation Candidates scheduled for today will be held virtually via Zoom at 1:00 p.m.

The Zoom link was emailed in advance of the meeting to our Confirmation families. This meeting is for our 8th grade faith formation learners and Ave Maria Academy school students who will be confirmed in the Fall at Resurrection parish and their parents/guardians. This meeting will address important information regarding the theology and celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation, required forms and papers, Sponsors, Confirmation Saint Reports, 8th grade Rite of Election, and other details regarding Confirmation. A folder with all of the information that will be reviewed was made available for each Confirmation Candidate. Second Grade Sacramental Meeting: The meeting for parents on the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist that is scheduled for **Sunday, February 6th**, will be held virtually via Zoom. The link for this meeting will be emailed in advance to all families with children preparing to celebrate the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist at Resurrection Parish this year.

Upcoming Faith Formation Schedule: There will be NO religious education classes on Sunday, January 30th, Tuesday, February 1st and Wednesday, February 2nd, and there will be NO Catechesis of the Good Shepherd sessions on Tuesday, February 1st and Thursday, February 3rd.

There IS Children's Liturgy of the Word today, but there will be NO Children's Liturgy of the Word next Sunday, January 30th.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Children's Liturgy is open to children from 3 years of age to First Grade, and is celebrated on most Sundays at the 11:30 a.m. Mass at STM Church. Prior to the first reading during the Mass, children are dismissed and proceed to the Family Life Center, where they are presented with an approved, simplified version of the readings for that Sunday. They then participate in a brief discussion and an activity pertaining to what they have heard. This ministry is a GREAT opportunity for service hours for those preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation, by assisting with various duties during each session. The following words are taken from the book *In Sinu Jesu – When Heart Speaks to Heart: The Journal of a Priest at Prayer* by a Benedictine Monk. This book has an Imprimatur:

It is no little thing for a poor human creature of Mine to prefer My Eucharistic love to an hour of sleep in the night... By nocturnal adoration you will obtain from My Heart things which cannot be obtained from Me in any other way.... More souls are saved and liberated by adoration made during the night than any other form of prayer: this is the prayer that unites you most closely to My own nights passed entirely in prayer during My life on earth." (Nov. 12, 2012).

If you are feeling called to take a weekly nocturnal hour, the Wednesday 1AM and 2AM are open, and there are many hours with only one adorer that could add a second one. Also, second adorers or subs are needed Monday 11AM, and Friday 11AM.

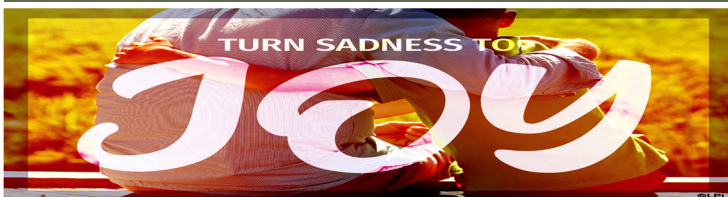
