

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

As the calendar year winds down, some parishioners are already planning their tax situation. Many individuals cannot benefit by itemizing their charitable deductions. However, there is another way to get tax benefits in 2022 by making a gift to Resurrection Parish.

Each year, any person at least 70½ years of age may make direct charitable gifts of up to \$100,000 per year from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) without having to report the distribution as taxable income. These annual IRA distributions are called Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD).

Directing all or part of your annual QCD to Resurrection Parish lets you make a gift that will benefit the parish and may reduce your annual taxable income.

To Qualify:

- You must be at least 70½ year of age when you make
- QCDs must come directly from an IRA account administrator to Resurrection Parish. Funds that are distributed to you personally and later given to Resurrection Parish do NOT qualify. Gifts from a 401k, 403(b), Simplified Employee Pension (SEP) and other plans do NOT qualify.
- Your gift must come to Resurrection Parish outright. It cannot be used to establish a life-income arrangement.
- The distribution will not increase your taxable income, but it will also not generate a charitable deduction for income tax purposes.
- The QCD would count towards your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). If you are 72 and older, the transfer of funds counts toward your annual Required Distribution from your IRA.

If you would like to make an IRA QCD for 2022, you need only direct your IRA Administrator to make the distribution to the parish by filling out a form letter of instruction and sending it to them. A letter thanking you will be sent for your records.




