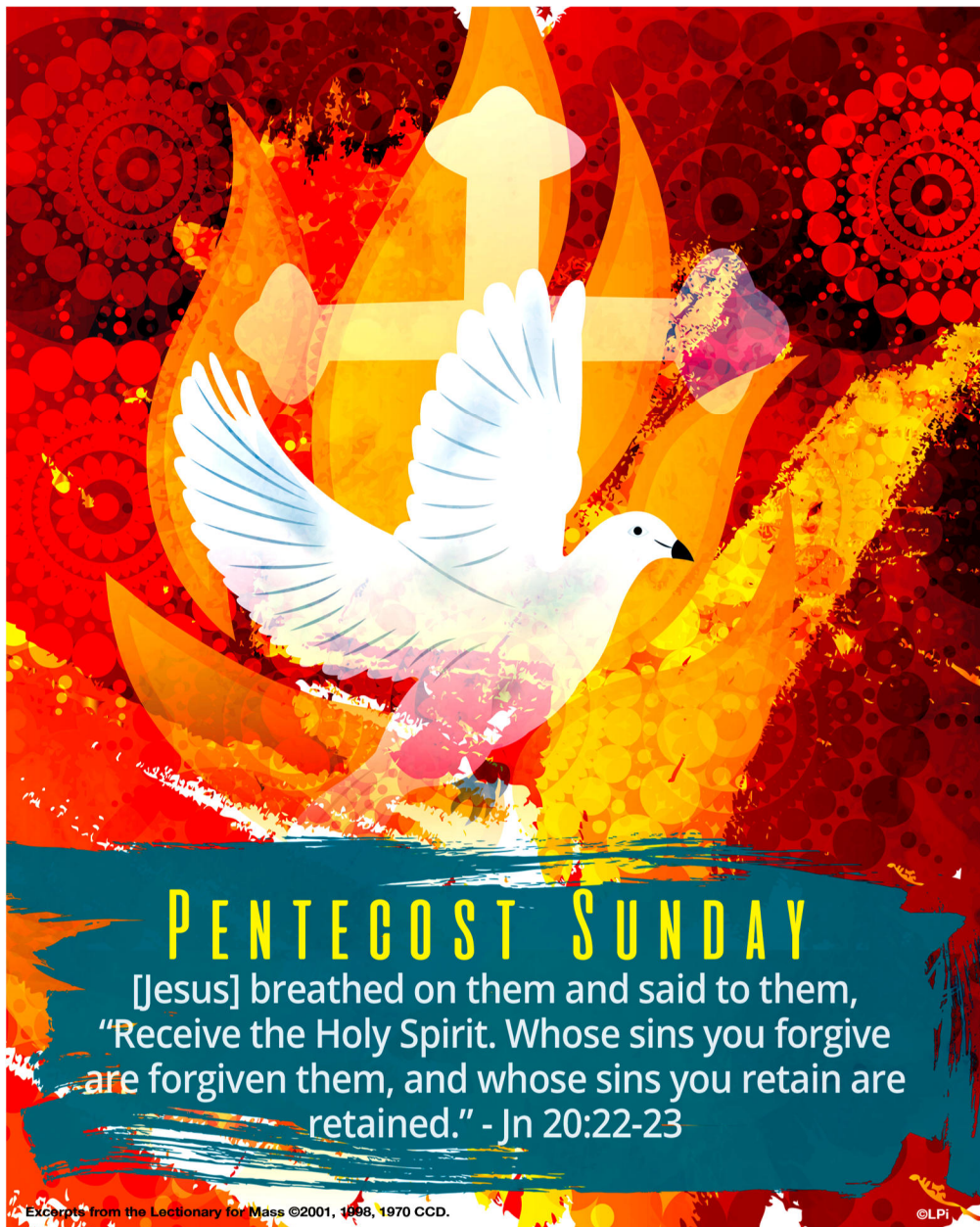

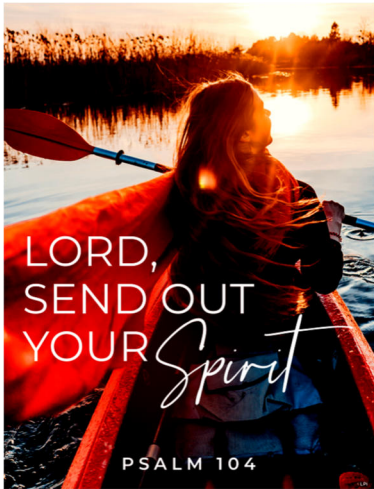
# REFLECTION

Pastor's Letter



ark, My Words:

Pentecost is "The Birthday of the Church" in the sense that it marked the first public showing-forth, the celebration of the church's amazing identity and mission for all to see. As a church, we are a diversity of cultures, backgrounds, and languages never heard of in history, but all fully united as one in the worship of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.



If, by some miracle, you and I have found the grace to believe these mysteries, then it's party time! We are blessed to know who we are, and whose we are.

The church of Jesus Christ is his living body... and Pentecost is the day we receive our mission from Jesus: to do, through the church, the great work we cannot do on our own. We should jump with joy at receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which help us to place ourselves at the service of the world. As St. Paul says, our mission leads us from gifts, to service: "...there are different forms of service, but the same Lord; there are different workings, but the same God who produces all of them in everyone." Pentecost should give us a new reverence for the wild and wonderful workings of the Holy Spirit. Let's be grateful that the Spirit "blows where it will," to produce different results in different people.

## NEED SOME TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE?

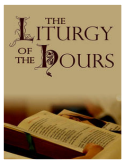

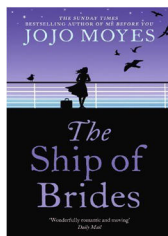

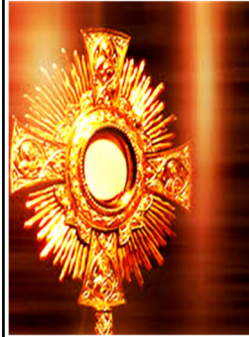

On **June 19** a Eucharistic procession will take place immediately following the 11:30AM Mass at St. Thomas More. After Benediction there will be a free Corpus Christi cookout for all to enjoy!

There will be four outdoor altars set up as we process down Oxford Dr., behind St. Thomas More Manor, in front of the school and back to the church for Benediction.

Worship aids will be provided, and a choir and bell choir will be joining the procession. Those who cannot process may stay and pray in the church. Indoor altar locations are planned in case of rain.

Calling all dads! This is also Father's Day. What could be more beautiful than beginning your Father's Day literally following Christ with your family?

This year Corpus Christi begins a three-year Eucharistic Revival called for by the United States bishops. *They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission "for the life of the world."*

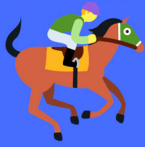
