

"There is need of only one thing." Lk 10:42, today's gospel

"Martha's trouble was not that she was scrabbling about, but that as she did so she forgot about Jesus. She was not making him welcome, she was constructing a meal. He even tells her that she was anxious and worried about many things, not the one thing necessary.

What is the one thing necessary? Relation to Christ.

Real hospitality means a two-way relationship in which host and guest open to each other, become present to one another in various ways. Hosts do work out the details of preparation, and they work hard. But they always remember the visitor while they prepare.

We are to find God in all things, in all the people we know and/or help, no matter how busy we might be. We are to relate to them because God is within them, deep in their souls. Touch them. REFLECTION

Pastor's Letter



This week, Jesus again goes against all Jewish expectations. Jewish women were not permitted to study the Scriptures with a rabbi. Women could listen to the public reading of the scriptures, but there are no known examples of women reading in the synagogue during Jesus' time.

Yet, Jesus affirms Mary's decision to stay listening and learning at his feet, like any other disciple, instead of doing women's work. This, again, is Jesus' way of wiping out artificial boundaries, and declaring that God's kingdom has no divisions, even within the Jewish family itself.

God sees differently, because God allows the lines to blur. We can learn to see differently, too. Blurring the

typical, expected images we have of life and people and events enables us to see deeper into God's reality. St. Paul did this when he said, "There is no longer male or female, Jew or Gentile, rich or poor...."

Do you know how desperately people need us Christians to bring this deeper vision to the issues in our world today? If we say, "There is no longer disabled or able-bodied, gay or straight, young or old....", we are teaching the world to blur the old lines of rejection, prejudice, condemnation and abuse.

Leave the judgments up to God! By allowing nothing but God's *love* to reign supreme, by trusting to God's timing and God's deeper wisdom, we are bringing the light of Jesus Christ into the dark corners of those precious lives for whom Jesus died.





2022-2023 Faith Formation Registration: Each year families are to re-register their children for faith formation classes. Our 2022-2023 online registration form can be found under the Faith Formation tab / Religious Education / RE Online Registration on the parish website (resurrectionpgh.org). We are planning for in-person sessions this fall, with traditional, classroom based religious education classes for children and teens in grades 1-8 at St. Thomas More church; and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level I (for 3-6yr.) and Level II (for first grade only) at St. John Capistran church.

At St. Thomas More, we will offer classes for children in grades 1-8 on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:45 a.m. and on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-7:00 p.m.

At St. John Capistran, we will offer both CGS Level I (for 3-6yr.) and Level II (for first grade only) on Tuesday afternoons from 4:30 – 6:00 p.m. We will also offer CGS Level I on Thursday mornings from 9:30 – 11:00 a.m. Home study for grades 1-8 is also an option for those families who wish to teach their children at home. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS): CGS is a faith formation experience for children ages 3 to 12 years old. Founded on the principles of Maria Montessori and Sofia Cavalletti, the catechesis is rooted in scripture and liturgy. Central to the catechesis is the atrium, a special environment created to nurture the child's spirituality with beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. Children grow in their relationship with the Good Shepherd through Gospel proclamations using the parable method, through prayer, singing, silence, and by exploring liturgical events. Hands-on materials (made by catechists and parish members) are used to help children and adults reflect together upon the great mysteries of the faith. Please see the information above for scheduling of CGS this coming year. Families may register their children for CGS online on our parish website under the Faith Formation tab. 
