



IS BEING IN R.C.I.A. DIFFICULT??

The question last week was, "So, what do people do in R.C.I.A.?". Now, the question is whether it is difficult being in the R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation Adults) program. The answer is NO!

Maybe you are concerned because you do not think you know enough about the Bible. If so, then R.C.I.A. is for you! Perhaps you don't know much about Catholicism and Catholic traditions and feel uncomfortable. If this is the case, R.C.I.A is for you. On the other hand, you might feel very well-versed in the Bible (pun intended) and feel that R.C.I.A. may not do much for you. Once again, if this is the case, R.C.I.A. still is for you.



Each week during the program we review and discuss the scriptures for each Sunday as well as various Catholic traditions. We also prepare you for the Rite of Reconciliation and for the Sacraments of Initiation, which are Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. At the end of this process, you will be confirmed as a Catholic. Inquiry sessions, during which you can meet and discuss any of the questions you may have about R.C.I.A., will be held on Sunday, September 14, 7:00 PM at St. Thomas Moore and on Sunday, September 21, 7:00 PM at St. John Capistran. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS): CGS is a faith formation experience for children ages 3 to 12 years old. The focus of CGS is to deepen the child's existing relationship with God; to encourage formation of a personal prayer life; to participate fully in the liturgical and sacramental life of the Church; and to develop a deeper understanding of Catholic identity and tradition. Founded on the principles of Dr. Maria Montessori and Dr. Sofia Cavalletti, the catechesis is rooted in scripture and liturgy. Central to the catechesis is the atrium, a special environment created to nurture the child's spirituality with beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. Hands-on materials (made by catechists and parish members) are used to help children and adults reflect together upon the great mysteries of the faith.
