



Haven't had a chance to attend the Jesus and the Eucharist study yet? Start this week! Everyone is welcome to this opportunity to deepen our faith. Each session opens with an exhortation from a different bishop, followed by lectio divina prayer with scripture. The main lesson is drawn from content created by the Augustine Institute and will include personal testimonies from Catholics across the country. We will then transition into small group discussions. This week's topic: Why a Church? Jesus didn't simply leave us a written message or instruction manual to follow. He gave us a living, dynamic Church where we encounter him personally and allow ourselves to be transformed into his likeness. The study is held on Wednesdays through **November 8th**; either in the morning at St. John Capistran from 9:00-11:00 a.m. or in the evening at St. Thomas More from 7:00-9:00 p.m. Both morning and evening sessions are identical each week. Fulton Sheen: Reason 7

Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen writes: Why make a Holy Hour? Here is reason 7:

7. Because it reduces our liability to temptation and weakness. Presenting ourselves before Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is like putting a tubercular patient in good air and sunlight. The virus of our sins cannot long exist in the face of the Light of the world.

Always I can keep the Lord within sight; always he is at my right hand, to make me stand firm. (Ps 15:8)

Our sinful impulses are prevented from arising through the barrier erected each day by the Holy Hour. Our will becomes disposed to goodness with little conscious effort on our part.

The Lord will withhold serious fall from him who watches. (1 Cor 10:13) With full confidence in his Eucharistic Lord, the person will have a spiritual resiliency. He will bounce back quickly after a falling.

The Lord will be favorable even to the weakest of us, if He finds us at His feet in adoration, disposing ourselves to receive Divine favors. Even the person who has fallen can expect reassurance if he watches and prays.

You are invited to take a weekly holy hour and enjoy the blessings it will provide to you and your family. Choose any hour 24/6, or a current opening: Sundays 5PM, Tuesdays noon (Rosary), Saturdays 3PM.

Finance Feature

If you're 72 or older... Help Resurrection Parish while cutting your tax bill!

If you're 72 or older and own an IRA, you've reached the age where you are required to withdraw money from your IRA each year (a "Required Minimum Distribution" or RMD). As the end of calendar year 2023 approaches, you have an impending deadline to take that distribution.

The current tax law contains a provision called the "Qualified Charitable Distribution", or QCD, that allows all or part of your RMD to be directed to a charitable organization such as Resurrection Parish. And because the amount of your QCD gift is excluded from your income, it can offer significant tax advantage to you, the donor:

If the size of your standard deduction - \$13,850 for singles, \$27,700 for married filing jointly - means that you no longer itemize your deductions, your gift via a QCD will still reduce your tax bill like an itemized deduction on top of the larger standard deduction. Let's say you're in the 22% tax bracket. If you took \$1,000 of your RMD in cash and then gifted it to charity, your tax advantage would be 0. If, however, you made the same \$1,000 gift as a QCD to Resurrection, it would reduce your reported income by \$1,000 and, therefore, reduce your tax bill by \$220 (22% of \$1,000).

For you to receive the tax advantage, the QCD check must be written directly from the IRA to the parish, i.e., you can't take the money in your name and re-gift it. Just tell your IRA custodian to make the check out to Resurrection Parish. You can make multiple QCDs, e.g., separate QCDs, for the offertory and for the Parish Appeal (new name for Parish Share). You can also give to multiple charities using this strategy, up to an annual limit of \$100,000.

Your IRA custodian can help you set up the mechanics of the gift, which are straightforward. Resurrection thanks you in advance for your generosity.



Guidelines for 2024 Mass Intentions

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful part of our Catholic tradition. In our parish there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. In order to be fair to everyone and allow as many parishioners as possible to schedule their Masses, we present the following policy:

1. We will begin accepting 2024 Mass intentions on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>October 5, 2023</u>. The Intention Form on the reverse side of this sheet **MUST** be completed and returned to the parish office by mail, collection basket, or dropping it off in person. Going forward, **ALL** Mass requests must be received on this form. Extra copies of the form are available in the Parish Office and on the Parish website, www.resurrectionpgh.org/mass-intentions.

2. NO MASS INTENTIONS WILL BE TAKEN OVER THE PHONE.

- 3. At this time, we will accept up to three (3) intentions per registered household for Resurrection Parish. This includes Masses requested at both SJC and STM; you cannot schedule three (3) Masses at each location. Of those intentions one (1) may be scheduled on a Sunday (including Saturday Vigil). The requests will be honored on a first-come, first-serve basis in the order in which the form is received at the Parish Offices. Sanctuary Candles are available at both Church locations. Please stop by the Parish Office to make arrangements. PLEASE NOTE: Weekday Mass times could be subject to change. If this would occur, you will be notified.
- **4.** A \$10 offering, as determined by diocesan policy, is requested for each Mass intention and **MUST** be included with the Mass Intention Form. Checks should be made out to Resurrection Parish.
- 5. Please note the following policy for requested Mass intentions:
 - a. Only one (1) Mass intention may be scheduled per Mass time.
 - b. One (1) Mass every Sunday must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners, as required by the law of the Church.
 - c. Only one (1) Mass per week (Sunday-Saturday) may be scheduled for the same intention.
 - d. Only one (1) Mass intention per week (Sunday-Saturday) may be requested by the same registered household.
 - e. Each Mass is for <u>ONE</u> person or husband and wife deceased or spiritual and temporal welfare. Also, <u>ONE</u> Mass can be said for the deceased members of a family, not multiples.
- 6. If it is not possible to schedule an intention for the date requested, you will be notified by the Parish Office and asked to provide an alternate date. An unavailable date is the ONLY reason you will receive a phone call. If you do not receive a call from the Parish Office, then we were able to accommodate the dates you requested.
- 7. Sanctuary Candle Memorials also are available at both Churches and are lit for one week in memory of your loved one. One candle request per family each year. The suggested donation is \$10.
