

Pastor's Letter

Pastoral Impressions...

Do you have a favorite saint? I would imagine that many of us have a particular person that we admire for their witness to Christ and their love of God. We may admire a saint's heroic virtue like St. Francis of Assisi, willingness to give their life like St. Maximilian Kolbe, or their teaching like St. Teresa of Avila. This coming week the Church celebrates All Saints Day on Wednesday, November 1st, a time in which we honor those men and women who emulated Christ so well. There is a tendency to perhaps believe that holiness is not attainable, but we are all called to be holy - we are all called to be saints! A saint is a person who lived an ordinary human life, but did so with extraordinary love and fidelity to God's will. 

Fulton Sheen: Reason 10

Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen writes: Why make a Holy Hour? Here is reason 10 of 10:

10. Finally, because the Holy Hour is necessary for the Church. No one can read the Old Testament without becoming conscious of the presence of God in history... The history of the world since the Incarnation is the way of the Cross.

The rise of nations and their fall remain related to the Kingdom of God. We cannot understand the mystery of God's government. For it is the "sealed book" of the Apocalypse. John wept when he saw it (Rv 5:4). He could not understand why this moment of prosperity and that hour of adversity.

The sole requirement (of the holy hour) is the venture of faith, and the reward is the depths of intimacy for those who cultivate His friendship. To abide with Christ is spiritual fellowship, as He insisted on the solemn and sacred night of the Last Supper, the moment He chose to give us the Eucharist: Remain in me as I remain in you. (Jn 15:4). He wants us in His dwelling: so that where I am you also may be (Jn 14:3).


Mark Your Calendars - Festival of Scripture and Song

Resurrection monthly Gift Card profit



Gift Card Program Update

The parish's response to the recent effort to increase support for our gift card program has been very gratifying, and we offer heartfelt thanks to all of you who have participated; either by in-person purchases of gift cards after Masses or in the offices, or by using the RaiseRight phone app.

September purchases of gift cards generated a profit to the parish of almost \$2,500, an increase of 66% from September of 2022. If that rate of improvement continues over the remaining nine months of the fiscal year, Gift Card profits would be about \$60,000! That is a welcome increase from the \$38,500 realized in the prior fiscal year, and an important step in addressing the parish's operating deficit.

Please especially remember that a wide array of cards can be used during the upcoming Christmas shopping season. Physical cards will be available for purchase after each of the Masses at both churches, and at the offices during regular business hours.

Another option is to shop with your phone using Raise Right, 24/7/365. Download the RaiseRight app on your phone or register at www.raiseright.com with our assigned enrollment code. There are 750 vendors, many of which have e-cards. Pay with a registered checking account at a fee of only \$0.29 per transaction, or with a credit card at a fee of 2.6% per transaction.



A <u>Retreat</u> for Couples who may have Autism, Down Syndrome or an Intellectual Disability

As society moves towards increased inclusion of people living with intellectual disabilities (IDD), Autism (ASD) and/or Down Syndrome (DS) the expectations have shifted. People living with Developmental Disabilities attend schools, work, live, and worship just as people living without these disorders. This seems to be especially true in seeking loving relationships and even considering marriage. Adults with Developmental Disorders face many barriers when it comes to loving relationships. There are some practical reasons including limited access to transportation, little to no spending money, and few opportunities to meet with other single adults. One of the most difficult barriers is the idea that individuals with Developmental Disorders don't need or can't have this type of relationship and only negative consequences can result from dating. Systematic barriers are significant for people living with Developmental Disorders including federal disability benefits become cut nearly in half when a couple gets married. Often parents and caregivers turn to resources outside the Church to help them navigate the issues facing their loved ones. Although there have been different faith-based resources developed across the Christian faith, people have turned to secular resources. Rarely is faith considered in teaching healthy relationships or when couples are considering marriage.

Adults ages 18 and older living with learning needs who are currently in a relationship (no formal diagnosis necessary); couples will attend together.
