

"I will sing of your mercy forever, Lord, proclaim your faithfulness through all ages." (Ps 89:2, today's psalm)

The focus of today's liturgy is the Davidic covenant, the promise of a throne that will last forever. It appears in the First Reading, in the Responsorial Psalm, and in the Gospel, where the angel Gabriel announces to Mary that "the Lord God will give (her son) the throne of David his father."



Jesus is to transform that covenant, revealing "the mystery hidden for many ages." The throne in this new kingdom is to be occupied by "the Son of the Most High ... the Son of God." Indeed, he is "Emmanuel," God-with-us.

We are very close now to the coming of Christ. What would the world be like if we were to allow Christ to really come as king? If only we could join in consenting to God's rule as Mary did: "Let it be done to me as you say." Who knows what joy the world would know!

The Church... receives the mission to proclaim and to establish among all peoples the kingdom of Christ and of God. She becomes on earth the initial budding forth of that kingdom. While she slowly grows, the Church strains toward the consummation of the kingdom and, with all her strength, hopes and desires to be united in glory with her King.



This year, our ministry begins a new chapter by serving locations in the northern part of the Diocese of Pittsburgh and in eastern Ohio. We will stay at the Villa Maria Education and Spirituality Center in Pulaski, PA, which is a large campus used primarily for Catholic retreats and as the home for the Sisters of the Humility of Mary. We are excited about the opportunity to have our youth experience accommodations in a Catholic environment as our mission groups have done in the past.

We are grateful for our time and experience with the people of Elkins, WV and believe that serving a closer region - while still staying together away from home - will provide similar challenges and opportunities. Our goals and mission remain the same: Empowering our youth to build upon their foundation of faith through community/cultural immersion and adult mentorship.

The cost of the trip which includes needed supplies for the week, meals, lodging, transportation and more is \$500 per person. We have numerous opportunities to fundraise to offset this expense - which is another way to participate in and prepare for the trip. Look for info on our upcoming fundraisers throughout the year.

Registration is currently limited to 8th graders who are entering 9th grade in the Fall of 2024, current high school students, and young adults ages 18-24. AROUND OUR PARISH

Dear Resurrection Parishioners,

You may recall that in the spring of 2021, more than 750 Resurrection parishioners completed the diocesan Disciple Maker Index Survey through the Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) as a tool to help our parish with pastoral planning and evangelization. After this process, and once I became pastor early last year, I assembled an Envisioning Team, which includes members of our clergy, the Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Council, along with parish staff and parishioners. A CLI representative is assisting us in analyzing the survey data and developing a pastoral plan, which we will submit to the diocese in 2024. Thus far, we have adopted a Parish Vision Statement and three parish priorities.

The Resurrection Parish Vision Statement continually invites us to consider Jesus' great commission "to go and make disciples of all nations":

We are a Catholic parish that is united in worship, prayer, and evangelization. Rooted in God's word, the Eucharist is at the center of our community. We foster spiritual growth and manifest God's kingdom on earth on our journey to eternal life.

The Envisioning Team and I have formulated the following three priorities from the results of the DMI:

- 1. Parish Family. To enhance the parish family by reaching out to those underserved and at various stages of their faith journey as identified by the parish survey.
- 2. Youth and Young Adults. To build a vibrant, active, and engaged community of Catholic youth and young adults who value a relationship with Jesus Christ, mindful of the challenges of living in today's world.
- 3. Faith Formation/Evangelization. To embolden and inspire disciples of Jesus Christ through continuous faith formation and spiritual growth.

The Envisioning Team is currently transitioning into an implementation phase, where we will make these priorities a reality. We will meet in January, and we hope to complete the pastoral plan in the spring. Please contact me if you would like to contribute to this process.
