Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." (In 20:21, today's gospel)

In today's Gospel Jesus promises us that "I will not leave you orphaned; I will come back to you and you will have life." Our faith, nurtured in this great paschal season, tells us that God-made-flesh is God-with-us, never abandoning us and always filling us with life.

It should be a great comfort to all of us, who share in the pain and suffering of ordinary life, to know that the Spirit of Jesus is with us always. It should be especially comforting to know that Jesus will not leave orphaned all those whom the world casts aside: the poor and homeless, the racial and ethnic minorities, the sick and dying, the prisoner and the refugee.

The People of God believe that they are led by the Spirit of the Lord, who fills the earth.

Motivated by this faith, it labors to decipher authentic signs of God's presence and purpose in the happenings, needs, and desires in which this People has a part along with other men of our age.

For faith throws a new light on everything, manifests God's design for man's total vocation, and thus directs the mind to solutions which are fully human. Vatican II, Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, 1965:11

REFLECTION

Pastor's Letter

entecost from the Pastor...

The celebration of Pentecost is often referred to as the "birthday of the Church." The Lord, following his Ascension into heaven, promises to send his disciples the Advocate, the promise of God's Love, and he pours this out upon his apostles and his Church on this day. Pentecost was originally a Jewish feast (the Feast of Weeks) that referred to offering the first fruits of the harvest in thanksgiving to God. However, in the early Church, this feast came to refer to the gift of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. When the apostles were gathered in the upper room, the Lord himself appeared to them and breathed out the Holy Spirit upon them. Who is the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit is literally the personified love that exists between the Father and the Son. It is the Holy Spirit who, in Baptism, allows us to become the beloved children of God and who sanctifies us. The Spirit is the one who heals us and forgives our sins. He reminds us of all that Christ taught us, and he offers us gifts and fruits to help us build the Kingdom of God and truly become saints. Perhaps on this feast of Pentecost we can ask the Holy Spirit to come upon us and help us live out more fully our commitment to Christ and the Church. The Spirit is the one who gives us life; may we truly ask the Spirit to guide our minds and our hearts every day.

Chapel Sign-up Weekends Corpus Christi Procession and Cookout Eucharistic Miracles of the World Display

On Corpus Christi we begin year 2 of the 3-year Eucharistic Revival called for by the United States bishops. They believe God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission "for the life of the world."


Eucharistic Adoration is a part of the Revival, and we are so blessed to have a 24/6 adoration chapel at Resurrection Parish. Adoration testimonials and chapel sign-ups will be available at all the Masses June 3-4 at St. John Capistran and June 10-11 at St. Thomas More.

On Corpus Christi, June 11th – the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – there will be an outdoor Eucharistic procession immediately following the 11:30 a.m. Mass at St. Thomas More, ending with Benediction in the church and a free cookout with ice cream.

The Eucharistic Miracles of the World Display was designed by Blessed Carlo Acutis who died at the age of 15 in 2006. The display will be in the Family Life Center and Capistran Hall June 10th and 11th. The celebration and display will culminate with a Mass by Bishop William Waltersheid on June 12th at 7:00 p.m. at St. Thomas More, followed by a light reception.



First Friday Devotion This Friday, June 2nd in the Lamb of God Chapel, please join us immediately following the 11:30 a.m. Mass, to pray the rosary and to participate in a prayer of reparation to the

Sacred Heart of Jesus. On these First Fridays of the month, we will also gather in the STM breezeway, between the church and the Family Life Center, after the rosary. Light refreshments will be served. Please stop by and take this opportunity to get to know one another. All are welcome. See you this Friday.

First Saturday Devotions Our Lady of Fatima has asked us to take part in First Saturday Devotions for 5 months in a row for the conversion of sinners and peace in the world. As a sign of our devotion, and with the intention of making reparation for the offenses against the Immaculate Heart, Our Holy Mother requests that we:

- Go to Confession (may be 8 days before or after, if you are in a state of grace)
- Receive Holy Communion (can be received at a Saturday evening anticipatory Mass)
- Pray 5 decades of the Rosary
- Keep Our Lady company for 15 minutes while meditating on one or more of the mysteries of the Rosary.

One way to complete this devotion on five First Saturdays would be to go to confession, attend the Saturday 11:30 a.m. Mass at St. Thomas More, walk over to the Lamb of God Chapel after Mass and participate in the noon Vianney Cenacle, which includes a Rosary for priests, and stay afterward for 15 minutes to silently meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary, keeping Our Lady company.






