

Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; to God who is, who was, and who is to come. (Rv 1:8, today's alleluia)



One of the foundational truths of our faith is the "one God in three Persons: Father all-powerful, Christ Lord and Savior, Spirit of love." We can reason our way into knowledge of the existence of God, but we would never know of God as Trinity if it were not revealed to us.

There is much else about God that has been revealed: about God as giver of life, land, and food; about God as liberator and protector; about the God of peace and the God of covenant love; about the suffering God, the God of the poor; about the God made flesh, the God with us.

On this Trinity Sunday, it would be good to reflect on the God of our faith and worship. Do we honor the God of revelation, or do we honor a god of our own making? Do we honor the vengeful god of a merciless world, or do we honor "the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity"?

"In his goodness and wisdom, God chose to reveal himself and to make known to us the hidden purpose of his will by which through Christ, the Word made flesh, man has access to the Father in the Holy Spirit and comes to share in the divine nature. Through this revelation, therefore, the invisible God out of the abundance of his love speaks to men as friends and lives among them, so that he may invite and take them into fellowship with himself." The If you have been to any professional sports games, you have probably seen someone with a John 3:16 sign in the crowd. This excerpt, part of today's Gospel for Trinity Sunday, is a reminder of the hope we have in Jesus Christ. God loves you and I so much that he offered his Son for us and for our salvation.

As we resume Ordinary Time, the Church uses the first two Sundays following Easter to focus on the Holy Trinity (this Sunday), and the Body and Blood of Christ, *Corpus Christi*, (next Sunday).



The Trinity is a great mystery of our faith, and a truly awe-inspiring concept upon which to reflect. Our God is a community of three distinct persons who exist in a loving relationship with one another. It is this love that constantly renews and refreshes the world. God the Father is the unbegotten one who has always existed, and who is often referred to as the creator. Jesus Christ is his co-eternal and co-equal Son; He is the Word of God and the perfect reflection of the Father and the Father's love. He is often referred to as the redeemer. The Holy Spirit is the personified love that exists between the Father and the Son; He is the one who sanctifies us. Perhaps today, we can reflect upon the gift of our triune God, and ask the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to allow us to grow in love and in virtue each and every day.

Chapel Sign-up Weekends Corpus Christi Procession and Cookout Eucharistic Miracles of the World Display

On Corpus Christi we begin year 2 of the 3-year Eucharistic Revival called for by the United States bishops. They believe God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission "for the life of the world."

Eucharistic Adoration is a part of the Revival, and we are so blessed to have a 24/6 adoration chapel at Resurrection Parish. Adoration testimonials and chapel sign-ups will be available at all the Masses June 3-4 at St. John Capistran and June 10-11 at St. Thomas More.

On Corpus Christi, June 11th – the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – there will be an outdoor Eucharistic procession immediately following the 11:30 a.m. Mass at St. Thomas More, ending with Benediction in the church and a free cookout with ice cream.

The Eucharistic Miracles of the World Display was designed by Blessed Carlo Acutis who died at the age of 15 in 2006. The display will be in the Family Life Center and Capistran Hall June 10th and 11th. The celebration and display will culminate with a Mass by Bishop William Waltersheid on June 12th at 7:00 p.m. at St. Thomas More, followed by a light reception.

2023-2024 Faith Formation & CGS Registration:

The 2023-2024 online registration form will be available soon on our parish website. Each year families are to re-register their children for class. Current Faith Formation and CGS families will receive an email when the online registration is available.

- We will have Faith Formation sessions for grades 1-8 on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:45 a.m., and on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-7:00 p.m., both at St. Thomas More.
- We will have three sessions of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level I for children ages 3-6 years (through Kindergarten): Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11:00 a.m., Tuesday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., and Thursday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., all at St. John Capistran.
- We will have two sessions of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level II for children in first and second grades on Tuesday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., and on Thursday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., both at St. John Capistran. Level II CGS will be limited to those children who have been in Level I CGS and are moving up to Level II, as well as to those children who were in Level II CGS for first grade.
