REFLECTION

Pastor's Letter

On our Pastor's Letter page, we will periodically have articles submitted by various staff members to the parish.

C

allow me to introduce myself. My name is Colleen Pauley and I am the receptionist at the St. Thomas More office of Resurrection Parish. My family moved to Bethel Park when I was one year old and I have been a member of St. Thomas More, now Resurrection Parish, ever since. My husband, Dan, and I have been married for 32 years and have five grown "children" who all attended St. Thomas More School.

If you've ever visited the office, you would know that it is a busy place. I can help you with many requests and questions, such as Mass Intention requests, new parishioner registration, gift card sales, baptism scheduling, etc. If I don't know the answers to your questions, I will do my best to direct you to who can help.

Do you have questions about having your child baptized? You are welcome to give us a call and plan the baptism even before your child is born. The parish offers baptisms on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass at St. John Capistran and after the 11:30 a.m. Mass at St. Thomas More.

When you are ready to call, please make sure you have a date in mind that works with family members and Godparents, along with a backup date. If this is your first child to be baptized you will be required to take a baptism preparation class. These are offered every other month, usually the last Sunday at 2:00 p.m. You are also welcome to contact another parish for a class if our class does not fit into your schedule. You can call the Resurrection Parish office to get on the list to attend the class.

Many parents have questions on what constitutes a Godparent vs. a Christian Witness. Each person to be baptized is required to have one Godparent. Each Godparent will need to be an active practicing Catholic and will need to receive a sponsor eligibility form from the parish where they are registered. One of the sponsors can be a Christian Witness. This person can be of another Christian faith, but cannot have been baptized Catholic and then have changed to another faith. If all of this sounds confusing, don't worry. We are here to walk you through it.

If you need to obtain sacramental information and your baptism occurred at either St. John Capistran or St. Thomas More before our churches combined, you will need to contact the Archives of the Diocese of Pittsburgh at www.diopitt.org/sacramental-record-request.

Just remember that your parish is here to help you. Don't hesitate to call with any questions or concerns. You can also refer to the staff emails that are listed on the last page of the bulletin if it is easier for you to contact us that way.

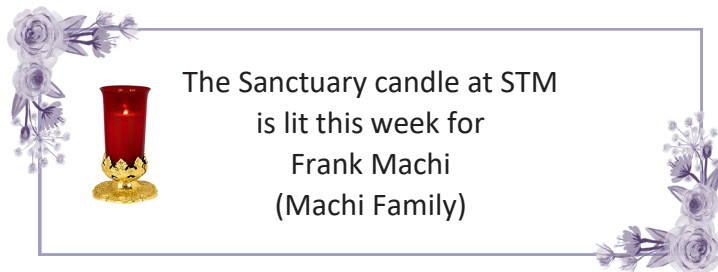

Finding the Chapel

What is the simplest way to get to the large parking lot of STM Church nearest the chapel if you are on Fort Couch Road coming from St. John Capistran?

Make a left turn at the stoplight at Oxford drive, pass up St. Thomas More Church on the right, and continue to St. Thomas More Manor – a multi-level apartment building. There is a stoplight in front of STM Manor. Make a right turn there on Spirit St. Follow the road to the right, around Ave Maria Academy, and into the main parking lot of the church.

Turn right into the parking lot. Look for the entrance marked with signs that say "Lamb of God Chapel" - near the statue of St. Anthony and the American flag. You can get to the entrance from the ramp in front of the church office, or take the stairs near the statue.

There is an image of a Lamb on the corner of the building. Go through those doors, into the church foyer, and locate the stained-glass door of the chapel with an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Eucharist.

Come on in. There will be a holy water font immediately on the wall to the right, and the altar holding the monstrance containing the Lord is on the left. Just genuflect as you would coming into church as you are able, and find a spot to enjoy some time to rest in prayer with Jesus. This is your chapel too.

Jon is a native of Rochester, NY and served as a trumpeter in the Pittsburgh area before joining us at Resurrection Parish. Jon received a bachelor's degree in Trumpet Performance from the Mary Pappert School of Music at Duquesne University. While at Duquesne, he studied with Micah Wilkinson and Chad Winkler of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra and participated in various large ensembles and chamber groups. As a freelance trumpeter, Jon regularly subs with the River City Brass and the Johnstown Symphony Orchestra.

Jon is also an accomplished organist and pianist. At Duquesne University, he studied organ with Dr. Ann Labounsky for nearly four years and performed regularly at Duquesne. Throughout his time at Duquesne, Jon served as an organist at Heinz Memorial Chapel, assisting with the PSALM Ministry for Lutheran students at the University of Pittsburgh and Carnegie Mellon University. Alongside his work at the student center, he regularly subbed in with several Catholic parishes throughout the Pittsburgh region, including Divine Grace Parish and St. Ann Parish, in Cranberry and Rostraver respectively.

Here at our parish, Jon will serve on the weekends as organist at both churches along with directing our Children's Music Program, which consists of the Joyful Noise Ringers and The King's Singers Choir. Jon will also be involved in our Summer Music Camp by serving as an instructor this year and by leading the camp next summer. He is very energetic and ready to build upon the strong and growing music program here at Resurrection Parish.

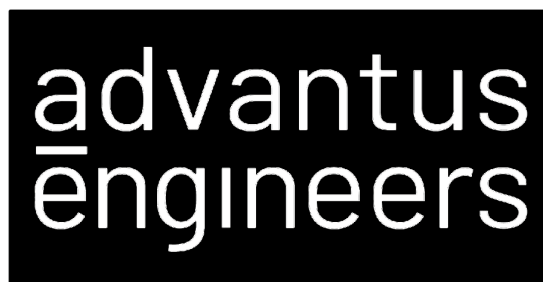
