*On our Pastor's Letter page, we will periodically have articles submitted by various staff members to the parish.*

My name is Jennifer O'Rourke. I have been a parishioner of Resurrection Parish for 15 years. I have been an employee of our parish in our Religious Education program for ten years. My family has been very active in our Parish in many capacities, but our favorite is the week we spend in West Virginia for our yearly Appalachia mission trip.

My husband, Sean and my son, Nick started going ten years ago. My daughter Julia and I have been going for eight years. Our youngest, Meghan will be going for her fourth year this July.

We look forward to a week of us working together and helping others in need.

Many of you donate to this mission and it is very much needed and appreciated. There are approximately 85-100 adults and teenagers that travel to Elkins, W.V. We stay at Davis and Elkins College. Elkins and the surrounding towns are used to seeing us every July and welcome us with open arms.

We start every morning with Mass together, breakfast, and then we head off to approximately seven home sites. We spend all day at our home site; building handicap ramps, replacing roofs and siding, and building and repairing decks. The teens are taught safety and how to use the tools properly to finish these projects. They are 100% involved in everything we do. A big part of our week is meeting and building a relationship with the homeowners. We have gained such pleasure in meeting them and learning their stories.

In the evenings we have different activities planned every night. The kids look forward to playing Catholic trivia with Fr. Mike or praying the rosary outside in the grass. We are all exhausted physically but rejuvenated spiritually by the end of the week.

We are grateful for your support of this ministry. Thank you for helping us help others like God intended us to do. Please keep all of us in your prayers.

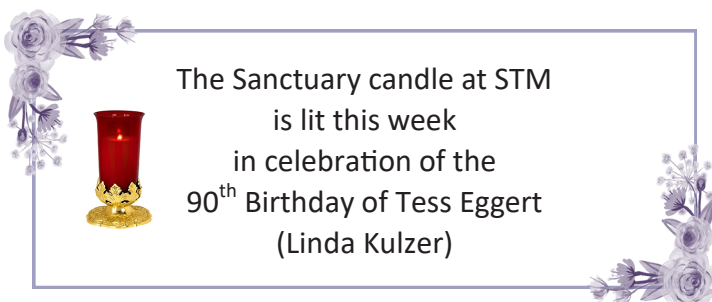

# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



## 2023-2024 Faith Formation & CGS Registration:

The 2023-2024 online registration form is available on our parish website under the Faith Formation tab. Each year families are to re-register their children for class.

- We will have Faith Formation sessions for grades 1-8 on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:45 a.m., and on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-7:00 p.m., both at St. Thomas More.
- We will have three sessions of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level I for children ages 3-6 years (through Kindergarten): Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11:00 a.m., Tuesday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., and Thursday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., all at St. John Capistran.
- We will have two sessions of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level II for children in first and second grades on Tuesday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., and on Thursday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., both at St. John Capistran. *Level II CGS will be limited to those children who have been in Level I CGS and are moving up to Level II, as well as to those children who were in Level II CGS for first grade.*

*Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is "a way of being in the presence of God that is both unique to the child and a gift to the adult who stops long enough to notice."*

**Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):** CGS is a faith formation experience for children ages three to 12 years old. Founded on the principles of Maria Montessori and Sofia Cavalletti, the catechesis is rooted in scripture and liturgy. Central to the catechesis is the atrium, a special environment created to nurture the child's spirituality with beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. Children grow in their relationship with the Good Shepherd through Gospel proclamations using the parable method, through prayer, singing, silence, and by exploring liturgical events. Hands-on materials (made by catechists and parish members) are used to help children and adults reflect together upon the great mysteries of the faith. Please see the information above for scheduling of CGS this coming year. Families may register their children for CGS online on our parish website under the Faith Formation tab. # AROUND OUR PARISH

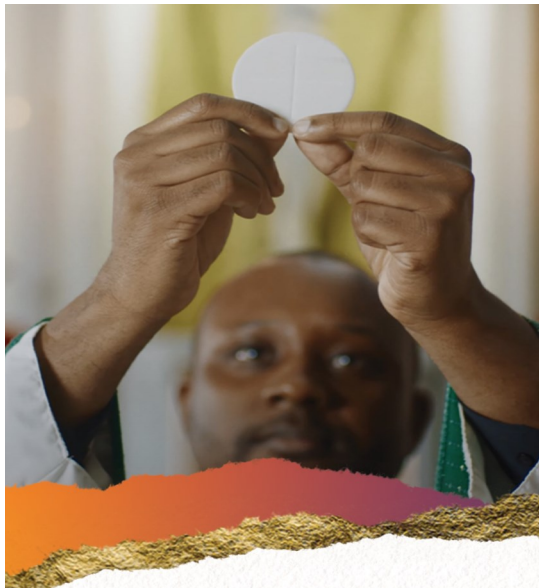
**The National Eucharistic Revival** is a three-year initiative, sponsored by the U.S. Catholic bishops, that aims to inspire, educate, and unite the faithful in a more intimate relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist. In a society where the Lord is often forgotten and even a majority of Catholics do not believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, the revival is meant to rededicate the entire nation to the eucharistic Jesus. Each year is dedicated to serving a specific purpose in the National Eucharistic Revival's mission.

*The first year* of the movement was dedicated to diocesan revival.

*The second year* of the revival, which has now begun, is dedicated to fostering eucharistic devotion at the parish level.

The movement will culminate in two major events involving Catholics across the entire country. In the summer of 2024, thousands are expected to participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage beginning from each corner of the country and ending in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress July 17–24, 2024.

*The third and final year*, following the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress, will be dedicated to the Church “going out on mission” to renew the world. Learn more at [www.eucharisticrevival.org](http://www.eucharisticrevival.org).

# Eucharistic Miracles Throughout History

Sometimes the veil between heaven and earth flutters, and God allows us a physical glimpse into supernatural realities. Below are some of the many amazing Eucharistic miracles that provide evidence for the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

## Scientifically Confirmed

### LANCIANO, ITALY

In the eighth century, an Italian monk had doubts while saying Mass. As he said the words of consecration, the host visibly changed into cardiac tissue and the wine became physical blood. This miracle has been studied by modern scientists, who have concluded that there is no natural explanation. DNA indicates the flesh is from the middle east, matching the genetics and blood type recovered from the Shroud of Turin.

## The Waters Parted

### AVIGNON, FRANCE

The Chapel of the Holy Cross had the Eucharist exposed during the massive 1433 flood. The water in the church was 4ft high, but the center aisle remained completely dry, creating a clear path to the Eucharist.

## An Army, Defeated

### ASSISI, ITALY

In September of the year 1240, the Saracen Army stormed the convent of the Poor Ladies of San Damiano, now known as the Poor Clares. Though frail at the time, St. Clare carried the Blessed Sacrament before the army and cried out to Jesus for protection. The soldiers were struck with fear and retreated at the sight of the Sacred Host.

## A Living Person

### BALTIMORE, MARYLAND

On his 1995 visit to the United States, Pope St. John Paul II asked to visit the Blessed Sacrament at Saint Mary's Seminary chapel in Maryland. His security personnel brought in trained dogs to sweep the area. The dogs indicated that a living person was in the Tabernacle, and refused to leave!

## Even Fish Worship Him

### ALBORAYA-ALMÁCERA, SPAIN

In 1348, while a priest was crossing the river on his way to bring the Eucharist to some sick members of his community, he was knocked into the water by a wave, and the consecrated hosts were swept away! Horrified, he did not think they could be recovered. Some fishermen called to him from further down the river, where three fish suspended themselves almost completely out of the water, holding the precious hosts carefully in their mouths. One-by-one, they deposited the hosts back into the chalice and dove back into the water.

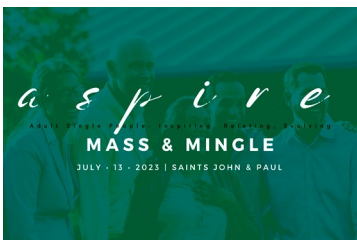

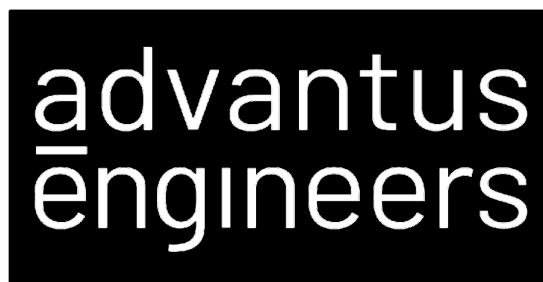
