



astoral Impressions...

On this Sunday, the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Matthew, Mark and Luke all recount this event in which Jesus leads his disciples up Mt. Tabor to reveal his glory and his divinity to them. Why does he do this? St. Gregory the Great tells us that Jesus revealed his glory to strengthen the disciples' faith in light of the passion. Jesus knew that the cross could be a scandal for those who believed in him. His kingdom is built upon sacrifice, charity and truth, which requires a profound commitment and willingness to endure hardship. As a result, Jesus demonstrates that he truly is the Beloved Son of the Father, the one who will redeem the world through the power of the cross. In our own lives, we know that our faith is often challenged. We may even at times wonder if persevering in faith is worth it. Today's feast reminds us that the sufferings of this world pale in comparison with the glory of God. It is an encouragement for us to continue to radiate Christ's glory in the world.

An Excess of Love

Reflection of St. Alphonsus Liguori: There has never been a moment from all eternity in which our God has not thought of us and loved each one of us. "With age-old love I have loved you; so I have kept my mercy toward you" (Jer. 31:3).

For love of us he became man and chose a life of suffering, ending with death on the cross. He has loved us more than his own honor, his own comfort, more even than his own life since he sacrificed all these to show us the extent of his love for us. Is not this, in fact, an excess of love which must fill with amazement the very angels of heaven for all eternity?

It is this very same love which has prompted him to remain with us in the Most Blessed Sacrament, as on a throne of love. He remains there motionless under the appearance of a little bread in the ciborium, without any external signs of his divine majesty, and with apparently no other purpose than to demonstrate his love for us all.

2023-2024 Faith Formation & CGS Registration:

The 2023-2024 online registration form is available on our parish website under the Faith Formation tab. Each year families are to re-register their children for class.

- We will have Faith Formation sessions for grades 1-8 on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:45 a.m., and on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-7:00 p.m., both at St. Thomas More.
- We will have three sessions of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level I for children ages 3-6 years (through Kindergarten): Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11:00 a.m., Tuesday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., and Thursday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., all at St. John Capistran.
- We will have two sessions of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level II for children in first and second grades on Tuesday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., and on Thursday afternoons from 4:30-6:00 p.m., both at St. John Capistran. Level II CGS will be limited to those children who have been in Level I CGS and are moving up to Level II, as well as to those children who were in Level II CGS for first grade.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS): CGS is a faith formation experience for children ages three to 12 years old. Founded on the principles of Maria Montessori and Sofia Cavalletti, the catechesis is rooted in scripture and liturgy. Central to the catechesis is the atrium, a special environment created to nurture the child's spirituality with beautiful materials that focus

the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. Children grow in their relationship with the Good Shepherd through Gospel proclamations using the parable method, through prayer, singing, silence, and by exploring liturgical events. Hands-on materials (made by catechists and parish members) are used to help children and adults reflect together upon the great mysteries of the faith. Please see the information above for scheduling of CGS this coming year. Families may register their children for CGS online on our parish website under the Faith Formation tab. Please contact the Faith Formation Office at 412.835.6996, Ext. 226, with any questions.


