

# Notes from Fr. Jim's keyboard...



The season of Lent is here! May the ashes we received on Ash Wednesday be but an outward sign of our desire to grow closer to God and one another during this Lenten season. Our parish is offering many opportunities for spiritual growth throughout this season; as listed in the bulletin, on our website, and in the Lent brochure mailed to our registered parishioners. Our Sunday Scripture readings during Lent help to focus our goals. Let's look at today's readings for some inspiration:

- Our first reading... from the Book of Genesis is about the famous story of Noah and the Ark. The main symbol of the story is not really the ark itself, but the rainbow that symbolizes God's covenant with Noah and us. A "covenant" is much more than a contract. It is God's never-ending pledge of love for each of us. But we're called to do our part as well! This is echoed in the Responsorial Psalm refrain which follows: "Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth, to those who keep your covenant."
- Our second reading... from the First Letter of Peter also mentions Noah's ark. The writer sees spiritual significance in the story, comparing the waters sailed by the ark to the waters of baptism. And how appropriate this insight is, since the early Church emphasized Lent as a time of baptismal renewal, as Christians journeyed with those who are preparing for the nsacrament of baptism. May we keep these folks known as "catechumens" in our prayer this Lent, especially those from our own Parish who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil.
- In today's Gospel... Jesus goes into the desert for forty days, which prefigures our own Lenten desert of forty days. Emerging from the desert, Jesus proclaims: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand." This refrain heralds the start of our weekend Lenten Masses. How do we seek to be fulfilled in life? Through money, success, power? Jesus offers us a different vision. We are only fulfilled through him, as we strive to put his words into action: "Repent and believe in the gospel."

#### **Seeking Humility**

Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J.: We know what humility is. It is the virtue that restrains the unholy desire for personal greatness and leads people to an orderly love of themselves based on a true appreciation of their position with respect to God and their neighbor. Humility recognizes one's total dependence on God.

Humility is the one virtue that Christ most stressed in teaching us to follow Him. "Learn of Me, for I am meek and humble of heart." A good definition of the Incarnation is the humiliation of God. The Creator of the universe, without losing His infinity, assumed our humanity. The Creator became a creature.

During His visible stay on earth, the Savior concealed His divinity so that only His humanity could be seen. But in the Holy Eucharist, He hides not only His divinity but His humanity as well.

Where do we obtain the grace to be truly humble? From Jesus Christ, present in the Eucharist. The almighty God who became the Son of Mary appears now on earth only as what seems to be a piece of bread. We must beg Him, and I mean beg Him in the Blessed Sacrament to give us the humility, without which we cannot reach our heavenly destiny.

What emerges from this lively portrayal is a prophetic agitator who gave voice and care to the voiceless and marginalized, who proclaimed in words and deeds that all people may participate in the Reign of God.

# HYMNBUSTERS

Music During the Season of Lent

Previously, I used to host occasional articles named "HymnBusters" that would answer questions in the pews of "why we do what we do." I can say that being the Director of Music for nearly the past six years, I have the best planning team with Fr. Jim Chepponis and Jon Runion.

As you are reading this, we have begun the Season of Lent. For musicians, we adapt to changes in the liturgy to make the Masses more solemn. Here are some of the things to expect during the next forty days:

- Organists will not play preludes or postludes during Sunday liturgies. However, on Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), the church allows for that exception.
- We will sing our beautiful Gathering Rite, "The Time of Fulfillment," written by Fr. Jim that focuses us on the Gospel reading of the day.
- During the Season of Lent, the organ is only meant to lead the congregation in a minimal way without the loud fanfares of the other seasons. That means that after the hymn concludes, the organists will not improvise, but instead, give the congregation a sense of sacred silence to pray and await the coming of the Resurrection.

There are documents regarding all liturgical life of the church, including music. The document, Sing to the Lord, encourages sacred silence during the liturgy. In our culture, quiet times have become uncomfortable and a minute of silence can seem like ten minutes. Please read the excerpt on how we will focus on "sacred silence" in the next forty days:

Music arises out of silence and returns to silence. God is revealed both in the beauty of song and in the power of silence. The Sacred Liturgy has rhythm of texts, actions, songs, and silence. Silence in the Liturgy allows the community to reflect on what it has heard and experienced, and to open its heart to the mystery celebrated. [Sing to the Lord, 118]


