

Pastor's Letter

On our Pastor's Letter page, we will periodically have articles submitted by various staff members to the parish.

Here we are Lord.

Sometimes, there is much in our lives which can distract us from the core of our faith and our relationship with God. This in itself is a kind of desert and desolation that fits the Lenten season. St. Ignatius - founder of the Jesuit order - has a beautiful prayer fittingly called the *First Principle and Foundation* which calls us into focus. Here is a translation:

The goal of our life is to live with God forever. God, who loves us, gave us life. Our own response of love allows God's life to flow into us without limit.

All the things in this world are gifts of God, presented to us so that we can know God more easily and make a return of love more readily.

As a result, we appreciate and use all these gifts of God insofar as they help us develop as loving persons. But if any of these gifts become the center of our lives, they displace God and so hinder our growth toward our goal.

In everyday life, then, we must hold ourselves in balance before all of these created gifts insofar as we have a choice and are not bound by some obligation. We should not fix our desires on health or sickness, wealth or poverty, success or failure, a long life or a short one. For everything has the potential of calling forth in us a deeper response to our life in God.

Our only desire and our one choice should be this: I want and I choose what better leads to God's deepening his life in me.

Adoration and the Gift of the Holy Mass

Fr. Bishop Andrew Cozzens, Chairman of the Bishops' Advisory Group for the National Eucharistic Revival: As Catholics, we know that the celebration of the Eucharist, or Mass as it is often referred to, is the ultimate prayer; it is the source and summit, as we say.

But the Eucharist is such a profound mystery that we need to spend time in adoration to receive all this mystery has for us, especially to open our hearts and minds to Jesus Christ and learn to respond to him fully with our hearts.

Adoration opens the heart and mind to receive and respond to the gift of the Mass by allowing our hearts to receive the graces of the previous one and increasing our receptivity for the next one.

Diocese of Pittsburgh:

The celebration of the Mass is the origin and purpose of the worship shown to the Eucharist outside the Mass. Eucharistic adoration extends Holy Communion in a lasting way even as it prepares the faithful to participate more fully in the celebration of the Mass. It leads us to acknowledge Christ's marvelous presence in the sacrament and invites us to deeper spiritual union with him in the reception of Holy Communion.

HYMNBUSTERS

What is "Responsorial Singing" and how do we use it at Mass?

Responsorial singing is common in both worship communities and in secular music. The definition in the Catholic tradition is when the cantor/choir would alternate with the congregation. This is common specifically in liturgical chant. Another name for Responsorial Singing is also called "call and response," which is found on Native American, African, and African-American traditions. In the Native American and African traditions, everyone had a part in the music. Choosing not to sing or dance was never, and is still not an excuse to not participate fully and actively.

Now that you know what responsorial means, you may notice that we use this style of singing in different hymns and acclamations where the cantor and assembly has a role. Specifically, the Communion Hymn, also is a responsorial piece of music, whether we sing a piece focusing on the Eucharist, a psalm, or the antiphon of the day. The style is done in all pieces whether we know them without the hymnals or if they are newer.

Last week, I quoted the document *Sing to the Lord*, which contains guidelines that are given to parishes for liturgical music. In the document, the following information is given:

As a processional piece, the Communion chant or song presents particular challenges. The faithful are encouraged to grasp ever more deeply the essentially communitarian nature of the Communion procession. In order to foster participation of the faithful with "unity of voices," it is recommended that psalms sung in the responsorial style, or songs with easily memorized refrains, be used. The refrains will generally need to be limited in number and repeated often, especially at the outset, so that they become familiar to the faithful. [192]

When you are in procession during Mass, it is wonderful when everyone is singing the refrain of our Communion Hymn. When you get back to the pews, please join in singing the verses and give more praise to God. Notice it does not say that the congregation are forbidden to sing the verses of the Communion Hymn.

I pray that we can all continue to grow closer to Jesus Christ through our sacred music sung at Mass and if you have a neighbor around you who may need that extra nudge, please invite them this Lent to sing fully, actively, and consciously!

2024 Parish Appeal Campaign

The Parish Appeal, formerly known as Parish Share, is the management fee that the Diocese assesses every parish to support the services that the Diocese provides to the parishes.


Parish Appeal runs on a calendar year rather than fiscal year (July 1 - June 30) basis, so the appeal for donations annually begins in January/February. Each home address registered in our parish should have received by now a request for a pledge or a lump-sum payment.

We ask for your support of this program with a specific donation so that we meet or exceed our assessment. If we fail to raise the entire \$300,000 via these donations, any shortfall has to be made up from general parish revenue, i.e., Offertory funds.

Your generous response to this appeal in 2023 allowed us to exceed the assessment by almost \$50,000, and all of that overage stays in the parish.

We ask for your continued support during this year's campaign as it gets underway. As always, thank you for your support.

History of Liturgy of Hours Morning Prayer in South Hills Area 2014-2024



In early October 2014, four Benedictine Oblates affiliated with St. Vincent Archabbey met with St. Louise de Marillac Church pastor, Father Joseph Sioli, to discuss initiating Morning Prayer. He said that we had his support, that he hoped to see a reliable

core group, and shared the parish subscription ebreviary.com from which booklets could be printed.

Morning Prayer began after one weekday Mass. Verbal announcements explained the purpose and content of Morning Prayer and occasionally Father Joe would join us.

At short time later, a fifth Oblate from St. Thomas More Church shared her desire to begin Morning Prayer there one weekday after the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Father James Farnan gave his approval and joined us as he was able.

Two of the four Oblates, who met with Father Joe carried the request to St. Benedict the Abbot Church to receive approval as well after one weekday Mass.

Participants at St. Louise de Marillac Church requested the prayer to be prayed on more days of the week. In time, Monday through Thursday offered Morning Prayer either before or after morning Masses.

From 2014 through the beginning of the church mergers (which changed Mass schedules), Morning Prayer grew in the South Hills area. Master copies for each day were printed from ebreviary.com. Before the mergers and Covid, Morning Prayer was offered four days each week in three churches in our local South Hills area.

After Covid, Morning Prayer was renewed at St. Louise de Marillac Church and St. John Capistran Church. Currently, Morning Prayer is prayed at St. Louise de Marillac Church after the 9:00 a.m. Masses on Mondays, and after the 7:00 a.m. Masses on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Morning Prayer is prayed at St. John Capistran Church before the 8:30 a.m. Masses on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. 2024 finds a total of seven offerings in two churches: four days at St. St. Louise de Marillac Church, and three days at St. John Capistran Church.

Hope exists that word will be shared so that others will join in praying this beautiful prayer of the Church. We welcome all to pray Liturgy of the Hours Morning Prayer with us before the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at St. John Capistran Church. This official liturgical prayer of the Church finds its source in the Eucharist to sanctify all hours of the day in a prayer that is ancient and ever new.

All are thankful that Morning Prayer is offered in the South Hills area and pray that this growth will continue!
