

PRIEST'S DESK

What do these parishioners all have in common: Corey Block, Megan Holicky, Jennifer Kluntz, Jaci Kopet, Becky Kortuem, Paul Lopez, Fidel and Teresa Ruiz, Diane Traxler, Pete Vavra, and Cindy Widmer? They are all members of our Synod Evangelization Team (SET). They are joining me, Fr. Barsness, and Deacon Adelmo Gracia in a "School of Discipleship" this spring. We fourteen, from all four parishes, will join thousands of other Catholics from all around the Archdiocese to become pioneers in implementing the Archbishop's Post-synodal Pastoral Letter "You Will Be My Witnesses."

Four of us attended a kick-off event last week up in the Cities, and the other ten will attend it this coming week. There Archbishop Hebda, Bishop Williams, Kelly Wahlquist from the Flynn Catechetical Institute, and others described what the School of Discipleship is and why we are doing it. The School begins with Seven Tuesday evenings in a row—Feb. 7 through March 20—wherein our SET will meet at St. Wenceslaus in New Prague with SETs from other regional parishes for teaching, small group sharing, discernment, and prayer. Later in the spring, the SET will strategize how to put into practice in our own parishes what we've learned in the School of Discipleship.

Why the SET? Because demographic trends are sobering. According to US census bureau data, the overall population of Le Sueur County is expected to gradually increase over the next decade, including a growing number of Latino immigrants. Meanwhile, the percentage of those who were baptized Catholic and remain involved as adults is shrinking. The rest of us go to Mass, put money in the basket, and get our kids baptized, but telling others about our faith, and inviting them to consider it themselves, feels foreign, like what Evangelicals do. That mentality, Archbishop Hebda believes, has to change. I agree with him. The SET is how we can begin to change.

In short, if we keep "doing church" the way we have been, we will eventually die out. We have to "do church" differently. We have to redefine what we think it means to be a "good Catholic." It is time to move from "maintenance mode" to "mission mode." Reaching out to family and friends— those who have stopped participating in church life, and those who never did—must become our regular way of relating to others.

Truth be told, all of us SET members are a little nervous. We realize telling others about our faith is risky (What if they ridicule or reject me? Do I even know how to do this?). This is why we are meeting with other SETs for encouragement and support. Our goal is that what begins with the SET will spread through the rest of our parishes like leaven raising the whole loaf. We want not only to become disciples ourselves, but to "go and make disciples" of others, as Jesus commands us.

Feel free to talk to me and the rest of the SET members about how it's going, and pray for us. We believe Jesus wants more than Minnesota nice Catholic parishes; he wants places that are vibrant, growing, attractive, and loving. Please, Lord, let it be so.


