

PRIEST'S DESK

Dear brothers and sisters.

Fear no one. The stories of St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher are great examples of people who took our Lord's words to heart. Henry the Eighth wanted a male heir at all costs, and the pope refused to grant him an annulment to remarry to get a male heir to continue his line on the thrown. Henry ended up declaring himself the head of the Church of England and separating from Rome, solving the problem by declaring the marriage null himself. St. Thomas More, the Lord Chancellor, and family man, opposed the king as did St. John Fisher, a Bishop. The famous movie, "A Man for All Seasons," depicts More's last days opposing the king until his martyrdom for standing with the Catholic Church and the dignity of marriage. The two Saints died for their faith. These brave men stood against the current when so many gave way. They refused to back down and paid the price with their lives.

It is getting more evident that the time is coming for us all to stand fast to the faith in growing opposition. The principles of the faith are under attack and even more the principles of reason and scientific method are being undermined. We must stand with Christ and his Church even if at times it seems there is corruption. The truths of our faith cannot be corrupted. We can fail to live up to the moral life in weakness, but thanks be to God for confession. We cannot change the essential truths of our faith to fit current cultural trends. We are living in a post-Christian time where morality is made up according to individual tastes and feelings. From our culture's perspective, the disciplines of logic and reason are from a bygone age. We are however people who still believe in objective truth because God is the Truth from which all things originate. We worship that God who revealed himself 2000 years ago and who gave us the Church which continues to spread that revelation. We know the God of our faith and that he leads us through the Holy Spirit guiding the legitimate successors of the Apostles. We know we are broken yet called to the highest holiness. "Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect." To be perfect is to be complete or fully us. To love even our enemies as Christ. We were created to worship God. Yet when broken people worship what they don't know the devil twists it. This is why we are going to be persecuted because while we have a God in heaven, the world has a god in, wealth, pleasure, power, and honor. One god is earthly and the other heavenly. One leads to death and the other to life. Sin brought death into the world. Without Jesus, we are dead in sin. He came to revive the human race by his death taking on sin and giving us his divine life. It is only natural that we have antagonism between those who submit to this worldly life and those who seek holiness and heavenly life.

- St. Thomas More as a married man gave up his life. In his last days before execution in his prison cell he wrote to his daughter saying: And finally, Margaret, I know this well: that without my fault he will not let me be lost. I shall, therefore, with good hope commit myself wholly to him. And if he permits me to perish for my faults, then I shall serve as praise for his justice. But in good faith, Meg, I trust his tender pity shall keep my poor soul safe and make me commend his mercy.
- St. Thomas More pray for us that we might be courageous in our time and seek to trust as you in our Lord.
