Harry Belafonte was born March 1, 1927 in New York. He was an American singer, actor, producer, and activist who was a key figure in the folk music scene of the 1950s, especially known for popularizing the Caribbean folk songs known as calypsos. Throughout his career, Belafonte was involved in various causes. He was a supporter of the civil rights movement and a close friend of Martin Luther King, Jr. Belafonte was active in African humanitarian efforts, notably appearing on the charity song "We Are the World" (1985). He received the Jean Hersholt Humanitarian Award from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences in 2014.

The love in his voice convinced me that he was very sincere, and I thanked God for his clear witness to the truth that above all we need Him for He is our Loving Father.

Our Lord is truly present in the people whom we have the privilege to serve at the Red Door. His mercies are new every day! In this, it has been a great blessing to continue to welcome new volunteers and new groups to serve in our ministry.
