Offering Confession during Mass is a traditional practice that allows more confessions to be heard for parishes that need it (*see diagram above*). The Church says, "It is particularly recommended... that confessions be especially available even during Mass, in order to meet the needs of the faithful".

Confessing before receiving the Eucharist is a beautiful way to prepare one's heart for the Sacrament, and so we will now have a second priest on Sundays hearing confession during Mass!

We agreed that Divine Mercy Parish would become the official Parish of their branch! It is a beautiful ministry to witness, and we are the first official


Parish partner of the Hill District Vagabond. We were looking forward to an incredible experience through our partnership.
