Preparing for Lent

As we prepare to embark on a journey or difficult task, we prepare. The same is true for Lent. In the 1962 Missal there is a season of pre-Lent called Septuagesima (~70 days before Easter) which is used to prepare for Lent. While we do not keep the season of Septuagesima in the current Rite, we still need to prepare for Lent. Liturgically, here is what will happen at Mass during Lent.


-The organ will only be played to accompany singing. Organ improvisations and instrumental music will give way to silence. A silence to contemplate the events of Our Lord's Passion and death upon the cross. We need to accept the silence and not focus on what is happening next, rather, pray and direct your attention to Our Lord and His Cross.

-The Tract replaces the Alleluia. In Lent, the Alleluia is not said, or sung until the great Alleluia at Easter Vigil. This year we will sing the Tract in English. These texts are taken from Sacred Scripture and allow us to contemplate each Sunday the events of the day. More on this in subsequent bulletins.

- The priest wears Violet, symbolizing penance.

Let us prepare now what penances we will embark on, where & how we will give alms, when and how we will fast, and how we will abstain from flesh-meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays. May we have a penitential Lent so we can more fully enter into the joy of the Resurrection of Our Lord.

Prayer Times for Divine Mercy Parish




The 40 days for Life vigil is every day, for 40 days, from 7a – 7p. We are being asked to pray and fast for an end to abortion.
