### From Deacon Mike



Today's Gospel sounds very dire and ominous. It sounds as though there is little hope for salvation. But that is not the case. What Jesus is warning His followers about is a lack of commitment. Just saying that you believe in Jesus is not enough. Yes, we are

justified by faith. But if you think faith is just a membership, like a membership to a gym, you need to commit to using it. Just as a gym membership will do nothing for you unless you put in the work, so too faith is empty unless you do something with it.

You might be asking yourself, "What do I need to do with this faith that I say I have?" Well, there are several ideas that come to mind. First and maybe foremost, you should be feeding your faith. A plant cannot grow without water and food. Neither will your faith. One way to feed it is through praying. As you become closer to God, the grace that ignited your faith will increase, allowing faith to be strengthened. Spend some time researching your faith. Read books of a spiritual nature. Get involved in small group discussions.

There are definitely options available within our own grouping. If you are really serious about learning more, you are always welcome to attend the RCIA classes that will begin at the end of September. Yes, they are intended for people who are considering entry into the Catholic Church. But they are also a wonderful way to learn and grow as a Catholic, even if you are a "Cradle Catholic."

Another way to feed your faith is to minister to those around you. Maybe it is visiting the sick. Maybe it is helping the needy and disadvantaged. Once again, there are many options open to you here at home. St. James tells us that faith without works is dead. That is not because we are justified by our works but because faith must be put into action to be truly lived.

Do you want to be among those few who will be saved, as Jesus said in the Gospel? Then you better begin choosing to become more committed to your faith. Most of you received the faith through your parents or grandparents. But until you lose their faith and find your own, you will not grow and blossom into the child of God that you are intended to be. Choose to be a committed follower of Jesus. Christianity is not a religion; it is a way of life.

# ON MISSION FOR THE CHURCH ALIVE



MPH Updates: Parishes and Names

#### What's a Parish?

If someone asked you what a 'parish' is, how would you respond? For many, the answer might be to point to a church building and say, "there – that's a parish!", but that isn't strictly accurate. In fact, a 'parish' is a geographical region. When the Apostles first started spreading Jesus' Gospel, they founded the first Christian communities. Located in a particular city (Antioch, Jerusalem, Thessalonica), these communities each spread and covered a certain geographical area.

Later, as the numbers of Christians grew, it became necessary for priests to help the bishop in his ministry of all of the parts of his growing community. Each priest was given an area in which to minister – today, we would call these areas 'parishes'.

So, a 'parish' is really a geographical area that's a part of a diocese. Last October, when the implementation of *On Mission for the Church Alive!* began, there were 188 parishes that made up the Diocese of Pittsburgh. These 188 geographical areas were then grouped into over 50 "Groupings", each of which contained two or more parish geographies. (Our Grouping – "Group 451" – is made of up the five parish geographies of the Penn Hills and Monroeville communities.) Once the implementation of *On Mission!* is complete, there will be 55 new parishes that make up the diocese.

So, when our merger is complete in January, we will continue to have six church buildings, but instead of calling ourselves by five different parish names, we will have one new identity that encompasses us all, and we'll have one new name for our Monroeville/Penn Hills parish!

#### What's in a name?

As part of the process of becoming a one parish community, we've entered into the process of choosing a new name for ourselves. Recently, our Interim Pastoral Council met to begin this process. They discussed a number of potential names that we might consider. A name could be proposed if it fit one of these criteria:

- A name that references the Most Holy Trinity, or Jesus, or the Holy Spirit
- A title for the Blessed Virgin Mary
- Angels or Saints found in the Church's calendar of memorials and feasts
- Those who are 'beatified' and in the process of canonization

The list of ten potential names has been presented to Bishop Zubik for his review. Once the bishop has had the chance to review the names, we'll ask you for your preferences, so that you might let us know which names you like, and why. Taking into account your preferences, three names from the list will be submitted to Bishop Zubik. One of these three names, then will become the new name of our parish when we come together in January!

#### **Parish Assemblies**

One of the most important parts in the merger process is for all of us to gather to discuss our plans, hopes, and dreams for our community, and to review the process we'll follow, and answer any questions that we might have. We'll hold two parish assemblies in September in order to do exactly that! We'll meet on two occasions: at St Bart's on Saturday, September 14, following the 4pm Mass, and at North American Martyrs on Sunday, September 15, following the 11am Mass. We'll provide additional information on this page in the upcoming weeks!
