

THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today's Gospel has the crowd asking Jesus three questions. First, "When did you get here," to which Jesus responds by rebuking them for their failure to grasp his miracle as a "sign," an occasion to put faith in him. Their second question about accomplishing the "works of God" has Jesus respond that faith is the "work" that God wishes. Many scholars believe this is John's answer to the faith-works dichotomy emerging in the early Christian community. Faith is the work of God in the believer, John would have us understand. The third question asked by the crowd is a request for a "sign" that would allow them to put faith in Jesus, as the manna in the desert allowed the Israelites to put faith in the Lord God. Jesus answers by revealing himself as the "bread of life" that "comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."



When I was a young man, just beginning my career in the business world, I recall one of my first managers espousing a management technique called "Management By Walking Around." (As I recall, my friends and I made fun of it vociferously – "what?!?!? Getting paid for just walking around and chatting with folks?!?!? How can I get *that* job?!?!?!"). The idea was that, by getting out from behind one's desk and walking around, observing, and talking, a manager can be more effective at understanding the needs of his employees and the dynamics going on in the office.

The ancient Greek philosophers used this approach, too – they were wandering, itinerant lecturers. (After all, after you've heard Aristotle talk about syllogisms ten or twenty times, you get bored, and he has to find a new audience.) So, they would "walk around." Some folks say that this means that they would travel from place to place, and other folks say merely that Aristotle and his followers liked to stroll about as they lectured. Either way, the word for "walk around" in Greek is *peripateo*, and so the Aristotelian school was called the 'Peripatos' and the philosophers themselves were called the 'peripatetics'.

We see this word in today's second reading: St Paul tells the Christians in Ephesus that they "must no longer live as the unbelievers live". The word St Paul uses for 'live' is – you guessed it! – *peripateo*. The idea is this: the way we present ourselves to others, as we 'walk around' in our daily lives, presents a vibrant witness to those around us. It's either the kind of witness that says "I believe in Jesus and His teachings" or one that says "meh... my faith life is something that I do for one hour on Sundays, but it's not important enough to me to affect how I walk through my life."

Over the next few weeks, in our second readings, St Paul will continue to make the case that we, as Catholic Christians, should “walk the walk” and not just “talk the talk.” If we belong to Christ – and we do, through our baptism and our hope for eternal life! – then it’s important that our words and actions reflect that belief and identity in Christ. “Put on your *new self!*”, St Paul reminds us. “Put on your *baptismal identity in Christ!*” Only by “walking the walk” of Christianity can we witness to the reality of Christ in our lives.



“Management By Walking Around”? Hmm... the jury is still out on that business technique. “Christianity By Walking Around”, though? Ohh... that’s definitely what Christ calls us to do, every day!







Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my

instructions or not. "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God." In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, "This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord gave them bread from heaven (Psalm 78).

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

Brothers and sisters: I declare and testify in the Lord that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds; that is not how you learned Christ, assuming that you have heard of him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus, that you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

Order of Mass

Gospel: John 6:24-35

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: He gave them bread from heaven to eat." So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven (*all bow*) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
