

LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O Lord, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.




All Saints Day this year falls on a Monday, and is therefore not a holy day of obligation. (This is in accord with a decree issued in 1991 by the bishops of the United States and later confirmed by the Vatican; the decree itself is in accord with canon law.) As such, we will only offer the one regularly scheduled Mass on Monday, November 1, at CDS Monroeville.

But what is not abrogated – and what can never be abrogated – is the vocation, the calling, that we all share: to be saints. This can seem a bit daunting, I think. Oftentimes, when we think of saints, we tend to think of the great heroes of our faith: Francis of Assisi, Therese of Lisieux; Padre Pio; Thomas Aquinas; Elizabeth Ann Seton; and so on. This feast, however, calls us to honor and remember not only them, but also all the saints known only to God – those who excelled at living the Christian life in this world and are now forever happy in the next. More importantly, it reminds us to emulate them.

Pope Francis, in his general audience of November 19, 2014, offered this passionate reflection: "...many times we are tempted to think that sainthood is reserved only to those who have the opportunity to break away from daily affairs in order to dedicate themselves exclusively to prayer. But it is not so!... Sanctity is something greater, deeper, which God gives us. Indeed, it is precisely in living with love and offering one's own Christian witness in everyday affairs that we are called to become saints. And each in the conditions and the state of life in which he or she finds him- or herself... This is it: every state of life leads to holiness, always! In your home, on the street, at work, at church, in that moment and in your state of life, the path to sainthood has been opened. Don't be discouraged to pursue this path. It is God alone who gives us the grace. The Lord asks only this: that we be in communion with Him and at the service of our brothers and sisters."

In a world that seems to be so bereft of holiness, let us all strive to be saints!

Tuesday is the Feast of All Souls Day, where we pray for all the dead, especially the poorest of souls in purgatory; and in a particular way, we remember those that we have lost in the course of the past year. There will be a special prayer service at both of our churches Tuesday evening to remember our faithful departed. To quote the Holy Father again: “Prayers for the faithful departed, offered in confident trust that they now live with God, also greatly benefit ourselves on this, our earthly pilgrimage. They instil in us a true vision of life; they reveal to us the meaning of the trials we must endure to enter the kingdom of God; they open our hearts to true freedom and inspire us unceasingly to seek eternal riches.” (Homily at Holy Mass for the repose of the souls of the cardinals and bishops who died over the course of the year, November 5, 2020)



Finally, on a personal note, I want to thank everyone for the warm welcome I’ve received. I sense a real openness to the working of the Holy Spirit and a deep desire to do the work of building up the Church in this corner of the world, and I look forward to working with you on that goal for many years to come.

Ms. Rossetti's kindergartners are back in action as they start off a new school year. Their first month back was a great success. They boys and girls have done a great job adjusting to their new routine. They are working hard in all their subject areas. In language arts, they are focusing largely on word families. This gives them a lot of rhyming practice which is an important pre-reading skill. They researched bats and are now researching spiders. They will be writing an informational text on what they learn. Their love for math continues to grow as they move on to teen numbers. Using manipulatives is an important part of their lesson each day. They are even learning to use a number line to identify what number comes before and after a particular number. In religion, they just finished up learning about the Holy Trinity and now they are learning how to pray the Rosary. They begin and end each day in prayer and attended their first school mass. Next, they are going to do some fun experiments and STREAM activities using pumpkins just in time for Halloween!



First Reading:

Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses spoke to the people, saying: "Fear the LORD, your God, and keep, throughout the days of your lives, all his statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you, and thus have long life. Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them, that you may grow and prosper the more, in keeping with the promise of the LORD, the God of your fathers, to give you a land flowing with milk and honey. "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone!

Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today."

Responsorial Psalm: — I love you, Lord, my strength (Psalm 18).

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Brothers and sisters: The levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.


